Riders on Freight Upheld. MUNICE, Ind .- If one who is riding on a freight train pays an employe of the railway company anything of value for the privilege of riding; he cannot be punished as a train jumper or trespasser, according to William A. McClellan, city judge. Even tho the railroad employe has not the authority to collect payment, if he does collect, the person riding has a right to regard himself as entitled to the protection of the railroad, the court holds.

The matter came up when four men, arrested by local detectives on a charge of train jumping. One of the men testified they had given a brakeman \$1-30, all they had among them, for the privilege of riding from Lima. O., to Indianapolis.

But if you do not hold them for five years you get only 3% interest on the money lavested in them from the time you bought them until you cash them in. To get 4% compound interest you must hold them to the date of muturity, which is January 1, 1023.
