Washington .- The next draft of men will come in June. according to present plans of the war department. This information was given out by Marshal Crowder. Some calls will be issued here and there for men over the entire country, to fill places in the camps where vacancies have been created, but the second draft call will not be made until June The exact numbers of men to be drafted at that time has not been determined, but as all cantonement camps should be ready to receive their full quota then it is ex-pected the call will be for close to one million men.


