Operating revenues of one hundred and fifty of the larger railroads of the country for December was \$288,103,445 as con pared with \$267,644,682 for December, 1916, according to reports received by interstate commerce commission. Expenses of the roads during December were \$217.800,210, against \$182,116,075 for the corresponding month in 1916. Net revenue of the same roads totaled \$70,303,235, as compared with \$85,528,607 for De-cember, 1916.
