WARNING BY REFERENCE TO FILING REGISTRATION CARDS.

The government furnished the registration card that the committee is using, and has requested that every person that is independent and has an existing capacity shall fill out one of the cards and file with the committee. Out of some 5000 cards sent out over the country, over 1000 have been returned. The cards are being returned very promptly, and some of the business men of the city of North Platte, which should have been the first to be returned, as they received them first, and could have returned them quicker. It has been reported to me that some men stated that they had consulted their attorneys with reference to these cards. If the young men that are called to go into the service, would first consult their attorneys as to whether they had to go, we would certainly call them slackers. You do not need to consult your attorneys. I will tell you right now, you are not legally required to fill out this card. Neither are you legally required to refrain from eating meat on certain days. Do you consult your attorney on this? The government has asked you to fill out your card; if you do not fill it out and mail it you are refusing to comply with the government's request just as much as if you eat meat on meatless days or wheat on wheatless days.

The card system is the equitable way of selling bonds. It shows what your net worth is, what your income is and what you have done for the government to date. Consequently, it shows what you ought to do this time. Don't you want to know this? The card is not public property and will not be used in any commercial way. The card will only be seen by a few of the Liberty bond committee, the information thereon is confidential, and the committee having access are on their word of honor not to divulge the information thereon, and the same is only to be used in the bond campaign.

If you do not send in your card, the committee upon soliciting will ask you for the card, if you refuse to give the same at that time you will be listed. A copy of the list published and also a copy of the list sent to the State Committee. This is not made as a threat, but is simply my instructions, and they will be complied with.

As the train stopped, the stars appeared on the rear platform of the observation car, and bowed their acknowledgments to the crowd, and remained in view until the train pulled out. Contrary to the information furnished The Tribune, the artists did not deliver speeches, much to the disappointment of the crowd. Mary, the blonde, conversed with the boys and girls who climbed on the steps or stood near, and Chaplin and Fairbanks smiled continuously. Had some one in the crowd yelled "speech," it is probable that one of the three would have made a short address.

A CONVERSATION

Between Mr. Doubtful and Mr. Right

Mr. Doubtful: "I don't see how I can buy any more Liberty Bonds. I bought all I could last fall. I'm not a rich man and I don't think it's fair or just to expect me to do anything more than I have done."

Mr. Right: "Let's see—your next-door neighbor's boy enlisted, didn't he?"

Mr. Doubtful: "Yes, he's over in France now. Mighty fine, stalwart boy, that!"

Mr. Right: "Exactly, and some day that splendid boy, the pride of his parents' hearts, may go 'over the top' in a gallant charge, stop a German bullet, and fall in the mud and debris of No Man's Land. Isn't that asking too much of him, and of his family? Is that 'fair'? Is that 'just'?"

Mr. Doubtful: "Why, it's awful, of course, but it can't be helped. This is war, and men have to be killed in it."

Mr. Right: "You've said it—this is war! To win the war it might be necessary for the government to take your factory away from you, and ruin your business.
