NORTH PLATTE MAY SECURE DISTRICT LABOR AGENT.

The federal government has taken up the question of the distribution of labor, supplying those districts where labor is needed from districts where there is an over-supply.

To advance this project a meeting was held at the Chamber of Commerce Friday evening at which was present J. L. McGrew, of Washington, D. C., special representative of the U. S. Employment Service.

Treasury War Operations.

Some figures from the Treasury department may be of interest in connection with the drive for the third Liberty loan, soon to commence. The public mind is bewildered with the talk of billions that have been or are to be expended in connection with the war.

The ordinary expenditures of the government from July 1, 1917, to March 16, 1918, were \$4,233,261,000, or over \$13,000,000 a day.

The receipts of the Treasury in this same time were \$11,017,267,000, derived from all sources, including bond sales and issuance of certificates of indebtedness.

In announcing the loan, Secretary McAdoo called attention to the fact that expenditures had fallen slightly below estimates and gave it as his opinion that the sum asked would be ample for Treasury requirements for the remainder of the calendar year.

Attention was directed to the probable return of hog cholera this spring and to the growing presence of contagious abortion in cattle. It was suggested that a State Veterinarian should be established here and steps are being taken to get a Federal man on the ground to assist farmers not only in this county but this part of the state to control these diseases.
