NORTH PLATTE MAY SECURE DISTRICT LABOR AGENT.

The federal government has taken up the question of the distribution of labor, supplying those distircts where labor is needed from districts where there is an over-supply. For this purpose Nebraska has been divided into several districts, each in charge of an agent, and North Platte will probably be designated as one of the points at which an agent will be located. This agent will have charge of a district extending from the east line of Lincoln county, to the west end of the state, taking in all the counties immediately north and south of the Union Pacific Railroad.

To advance this project a meeting was held at the Chamber of Commerce Friday evening at which was present J. L. McGrew, of Washington, D. C. special representative of the U. S. Employment Service, who stated the object of this service, and the good that would result to the employers of labor in western Nebraska. The plan as suggested is that an employer who needs labor files his application with the county agent of his county. If the county agent does not have on his list the men needed, he apples to the federal agent at North Platte, who is in touch with labor conditions all thru the central west, and especially in the larger cities. If there is a surplus of farm labor in Omaha, Kansas City or Denver, he brings that labor to the points in Western Nebraska where it is needed. This applies not only to farm bands but to all classes of labor. ers and mechanics. The plan is to bring the jobless man to the job, and these days here in western Nebraska where the labor problem is a serious one, the establishing of the employment bureau will be undoubtedly of great service to the people. cock
