100,00 OLD TIME ENGINEERS RETIRE ON PENSIONS

> At the meeting of the Union Pacific pension board at Omaha last week, the retirement of W. C. Reynolds and H. N. Smith, of this city, was accepted and they were placed on the pension list. Each will receive a pension of about seventy dollars per month.

Engineer Reynolds retires after forty-one years of continuous service, having entered the employ of the company as a fireman April 1, 1877. Durthat long period he gave the company 50.00 the best that was in him; he never fal-50,00 tered at the duty imposed upon him, 50,00 and he retires with the company's en-50,00 dorsement of efficiency and the goodwill of his fellow employes. Mr. Rey-50,00 holds, as soon as he can dispose of his residence property, will move to Southern California to make his home. believing the climate will prove beneficial to his health which now is none the best.

Engineer Smith entered the service of the company March 4th, 1877, as a section hand at Ogalalla. In May of the same year he came to North Platte and worked on the section under Foreman Brown. The following fall and for two succeeding falls he operated a threshing machine in Iowa. In the spring of 1881 he returned to 50.00 North Platte and accepted employment in the round house and six months later began firing. The last trip he made as fireman, the engine with Pete Masterson as engineer ran in an open bridge across Sand creek near Denver, and Masterson was killed.
