Railroad employees in North Platte who are not included in the train and engine service, expect to soon receive an advance in wages. This increase is figured to vary from forty per cent on section hands and other low paid labor to six per cent for the man who receives \$200 or more per month. To the section hand who now receives \$1.65 per day it means an increase of about \$17.00 per month. The raise will date from January 1st, and will probably be officially announced May 1st.
