C., arrived in town Wednesday and last evening gave a talk at the Presbyterian church. Red Fox passed through this city east bound May 25, 1914, riding a pinto pony. He is enroute home by the same method. He is a well educated Indian, having attended the Haskell school in Kansas, the Carlisle school in Pennsylvania and the high school in Billings, Mont. While east he attended for two years the Dr. White Bible school in New York. He is a Y. M. C. A. worker among the Indians and six years ago established an association at the Blackfoot agency. Red Fox is delivering lectures advocating the setting apart of the second Saturday in May of each year as a national Indian day, the granting of elective franchise to Indians and the placing of aged Indians on a pension and making the younger ones dependent upon themselves instead of being wards of the government. There are 5,000 Indians in the present war service, and the Indians have purchased ten millions worth of Liberty bonds.
