MEN 21 YEARS OLD SOON TO BE REGISTERED.

County draft boards in Nebraska will soon begin to make preparations for registering young men who have \$20.05. attained twenty-one years since June 1917, in accordance with instructions which have been received from the governor's office at Lincoln.

The machinery for classifying the new registrants will be in readiness when congress enacts the law which will put the movement into effect. The total number of men throughout the country to be affected by the law will be near the 1,000,000 mark.

A majority of the men will in all likelihood his placed in class A-1, local chairmen believe. June 5, 1918, the first anniversary of the great draft registration which enrolled 10,000,000 of America's best men, is the tentative dates set for the next registration.

It is assumed that in Lincoln county there are more than one hundred young men who have reached the age of twenty-one since June 5, 1917.




