NEBRASKA HAS A TOTAL OF 27,277 MEN IN THE SERVICE.

A total of 27,277 Nebraska men and boys have enlisted or been inducted into the national army since June 5, 1917 according to the official figures given out at the office of Governor Neville. Of this number 26,366 men have enlisted or been inducted by the local draft boards and 911 represent voluntary inductions. The tabulations at the governor's office show that there are 118,168 men registered in Nebraska, divided as follows: White, 110,596; negroes, 1,421; aliens, 5,216, and enemy aliens, 934.

When the order was issued to register all men in the United States on June 5, 1917, between the ages of twenty-one and thirty-one years for military service, local boards were established in each town in the state. In the first call Nebraska was asked to furnish 13,876 men. Credit was given for 5,691 voluntary enlistments, leaving a net quota of 8,185 men who were furnished thru the local boards. Hamilton county was not required to send any men on the first call her quota having been exceeded by the number of voluntary enlistments.

On the second call for men the state's quota was set at 12,490. Credit for voluntary enlistments or inductions amounted to 10,682, making a net quota of 1,808 to be furnished. In this call twenty-three boards were not required to send any men, having a large enough number of voluntary enlistments and inductions.

Under the questionnaire system 23.3 per cent of the registrants of the state have been placed in class 1. Frontier county ranks lowest with 11 per cent and Dawes highest with 45 per cent. Counties having less men in class 1 than the average of the state must bring the average up by reclassification or an inspector will be appointed to review the work of the board.

NORTH PLATTE WILL HAVE SOLDIER'S CANTEN SYSTEM.

Authority has been given to establish a soldiers' canteen at North Platte and at a meeting of the Red Cross Chapter Tuesday evening Mrs. Chas. Bogas was appointed chairman of this work. For this canteen service the chapter appropriated \$500 which is only the nucleus of the fund that will be needed.

This canteen service is to furnish sandwiches, coffee and other eatables free to troops passing through North Platte, and permission has been asked the company to use one of the vacated frame buildings at the depot for the canteen. In this building will be a kitchen equipped so as to supply the soldier boys with the lunches proposed.

While it is true that the government furnishes the boys with what is considered traveling expenses, the allotment is not sufficient in ninety-nine cases out of a hundred. For instance the North Platte boys who were sent from Omaha to the Mare Island navy yard near San Francisco were allowed \$5.90 each, a sum insufficient to meet the requirements of the average young man on such a trip. With a canteen service in North Platte whatever is furnished the boy in eatables helps him out to that extent. There is another phase to the canteen service, and that is the encouragement it gives the boys; the evidence that the people of North Platte are standing behind them. This may be regarded somewhat as a matter of sentiment, but let us tell you that if you remove sentiment from the people of this country you destroy to a large extent the enthusiasm in patriotic work and in patriotism itself.

Harshfield Indicted.

John Harshfield, who for many years has lived on Birdwood creek, about twenty miles north of Sutherland, where he owns a well improved ranch, has been indicted for sedition by the federal grand jury at Omaha.

Several months ago Harshfield was reported to the County Council of defense and later to the State Council of Defense. He was taken to Omaha and given a hearing before the U. S. attorney and allowed to return home. At the assembling of the federal grand jury in Omaha last week the charges against Harshfield and the evidence supporting the charges were turned over to the jury and the indictment followed.

In the complaint Harshfield is charged with applying the vilest of vile epithets to the president and to the cabinet; that he said, "I am a member of the greatest league in the world, the non-partisan league and I say what I please, where and when I please. I have ammunition and guns enough on my place to kill a regiment, and we are not afraid to use them."

Flats Plente.

150 farmers, their wives and children, gathered in Cody Canyon on A. R. Leavitt ranch Wednesday after the rain to celebrate their annual community picnic. The Flats Sunday School divided itself a while back under the sign of the Blues and the Reds, and started a lively membership campaign, the losing side to furnish the eats for the picnic. The County Agent can testify that the Reds, altho perhaps not good membership gatherers, were certainly there in the domestic science department.

Following the spread, a Red Cross auxiliary was organized, of which Mrs. Halse was elected president and Mrs. Deiner secretary. They take this office with a substantial start of \$51.40 in the treasury, besides a liberal collection taken during the day.

Grasshoppers.

There are enough grasshoppers in Lincoln county, to threaten serious injury in several sections, writes the State Entomology Dept., as a result of a recent survey. Poison is the remedy recommended:

Alfalfa meal or bran 15 lbs.; white arsenic or aPris Green 2-3 lb.; water, 6 gal.; cheap string molasses 1 gal.; juice and ground rind and pulp of 4 lemons. Mix thoroughly and scatter broadcast in the late P. M. or early morning, wherever you find young hoppers. This amount will treat four or five acres.

Specialist, Due June 14, 15, 17.

A specialist will be in the county June 15, 16 and 17 to give demonstrations as to poisons and hopper dangers. Anyone wishing to have a demonstration on their farm will kindly communicate at once with me so we can arrange to call in some of the neighbors.

U-Boats Still Active.

Two more vessels, a Norwegian steamship and one schooner, were added to the list of ships known to have been sunk by the German submarines which are raiding in American waters. The total now stands at five steamers and eight schooners. The fact which stands out most prominently in the developments is that the U-boats are still operating near the coast and have not returned to their bases, assuring that the two which already have been identified are the only ones on this side of the Atlantic. This was demonstrated when the Norwegian steamer Eldsvold was sunk off the Virginia capes. The location of the attacks shows also that the submarines are moving steadily southward, if they are the same ones which attacked shipping almost at the gateway to New York harbor. The navy department reports an encounter between a destroyer and a submarine off the coast of Maryland.

None of the vessels reported sunk thus far was sent to the bottom by a torpedo. It is considered certain that the undersea craft carry torpedoes and that they are conserving them in the hope that they may get an opportunity sooner or later to attack a transport loaded with American troops.

HOME GUARDS WILL HELP IN 4th OF JULY CELEBRATION.

In addition to the parade, there will be a cavalry drill, and drills by squads of the Guards and by the company as a whole. Invitations will be extended to the Home Guards companies at Sutherland and Hershey to participate in the parade, and if celebrations are not held at those places the invitations will probably be accepted.

ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY BOYS REGISTERED WEDNESDAY.

One hundred and forty Lincoln county boys who reached the age of twenty-one since June 5th, 1917, responded to the call for registration before the exemption board Wednesday. In the work of registering the boys the board was assisted by volunteer clerks.

One hundred and thirty-five of the boys are native born, two are alien, two are declarants, and one is colored.

Only a few of the boys who registered asked if they were eligible to a claim for exemption; the others were apparently willing to go and the sooner they could go the better they would be pleased. Several made application for the special training course at the state university, but whether they will be accepted is not at this time known. The boys who registered Wednesday will not be called until all the Class One men of the former registration are absorbed.

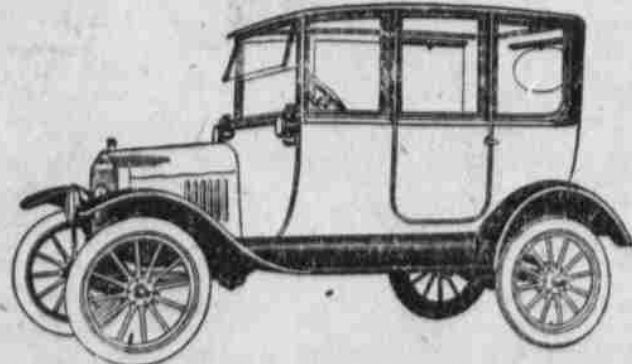
