**Depression Hits Hun Army.**  
A correspondent writing from the front says:  
A great wave of depression has been caused in the German army by the collapse of Bulgaria and the retreating of Turkey and Austria, prisoners declared today.  
During the day I saw several hundred dejected looking captives in prisoner cages in the rear of the American lines.  
One officer of more than usual intelligence said in English that the Kaiser has not the same hold over the German people that he formerly had. The German people still believed in the Kaiser to some extent, the officer said, but in the first flush of victory the people closed their eyes, whereas they are now opening their eyes.  
The officer said that he did not believe that President Wilson would accept the latest German peace offer, altho he had hoped so. His opinion was that the allies are now on the road to victory and would not stop until they had finished the German army.  
"The Germans know that defeat awaits them and they began to see it as soon as the March offensive was stopped on the Amiens and Marne fronts," the officer declared. "The knowledge had impressed more and more upon the Germans by Marshal Foch's successive victories. Now it is simply a case of making the best peace possible."  
"The allied resources are overwhelming Germany. And in addition to that many Germans think that the struggle has lasted long enough and must end, no matter what the cost. The Germans are probably unwilling to depose the Kaiser, but are sure to curb his powers so that he can never again rule with an iron hand."
