MORE WAR REVENUES TO PAY BIG BILLS

The chaotic condition of the world's finances, as they stand today, calls for great sacrifices being made by the people of America in the way of supporting future Liberty Loans, Secretary McAdob advised yesterday. "We do not know at this time exactly what the United States will have to meet in the way of additional financial burdens, but hunderds of millions of dollars will still have to be raised and sent," he stated.

That a long session for heavy taxation confronted the American people was intimated by the secretary, not alone to meet the needs of this government but also to provide financial help for the allied nations and the entire world. It was stated that another huge Liberty Loan would be floated and possibly even a second or third, in addition to which certafn high war revenues would be maintained.

To Peultry Growers. The U. S. Food Administration asks all poultry buyers to refrain from buying now and until December 7th all hen turkeys weighing less than eight pounds and young toms weighing less than twelve pounds live weight. Poultry buyers are also prohibited from dressing turkeys in any atmospheric temperature above forty degrees unless they are equipped with ice or artificial refrigeration to chill the birds immediately after dressing. Under the latter provision we are handicapped in purchasing turkeys for storage and can only buy limited number.


