MORE WAR REVENUES TO PAY BIG BILLS.

The chaotic condition of the world's finances, as they stand today, calls for great sacrifices being made by the people of America in the way of supporting future Liberty Loans, Secretary McAdoo advised yesterday. "We do not know at this time exactly what the United States will have to meet in the way of additional financial burdens, but hundreds of millions of dollars will still have to be raised and sent," he stated.

That a long session for heavy taxation confronted the American people was intimated by the secretary, not alone to meet the needs of this government but also to provide financial help for the allied nations and the entire world. It was stated that another huge Liberty Loan would be floated and possibly even a second or third, in addition to which certain high war revenues would be maintained.

To Poultry Growers.

The U. S. Food Administration asks all poultry buyers to refrain from buying now and until December 7th all hen turkeys weighing less than eight pounds and young toms weighing less than twelve pounds live weight. Poultry buyers are also prohibited from dressing turkeys in any atmospheric temperature above forty degrees unless they are equipped with ice or artificial refrigeration to chill the birds immediately after dressing. Under the latter provision we are handicapped in purchasing turkeys for storage and can only buy a limited number.

TO REMAIN IN CAMP TILL PEACE IS SIGNED.

"Do not proceed with induction or entrainment until further instructed from this office," Keith Neville.

Paroling is the substance of a telegram received by Secretary Allen of the local draft board, late Monday afternoon. By this order all inductions and entrainment of men planned comes to an abrupt halt.

The provost marshal advised all draft boards in the country Tuesday afternoon that no more questionnaires are to be placed in the mails. Those who have already received their questionnaires must fill them out and make returns within the time specified previously, but a halt will be made to listing additional men for service in the national army.

It was also announced that all troop movements have come to a stop and the plans are already worked out for return of troops in the camps. In this connection the provost marshal stated the men in camps would remain there until the peace pact with Germany had been signed and there was no longer any danger of an allied army being needed to quell disturbances in that country.

Red Cross Election.

The annual election of directors, of Lincoln County Chapter Red Cross will be held at Chapter headquarters in the Federal building on November 20th between the hours of 10 a. m. and 4 p. m. at which time fifteen directors will be elected. The fifteen directors elected, together with the ten branch chairmen will meet at Chapter headquarters at 8 o'clock p. m. on the same date for the purpose of electing officers from their own number and an executive committee as provided by the by-laws. 59,089 INFLUENZA DEATHS IN FORTY-SIX CITIES.

The tremendous mortality in the United States from the influenza and pneumonia epidemics is shown in a report from the Bureau of Census.

Total deaths in forty-six of the largest cities were 59,089 for the seven weeks ending October 26th. 36,032 were from influenza and 23,057 from pneumonia.—Richmond Times Dispatch.

Crown Prince Reported Killed. The German crown prince was assassinated by his own troops, according to an Exchange Telegraph dispatch from Paris Wednesday, quoting advices from Berne.

The body was found in a railway coach.

In addition to being shot, the crown prince had been bayoneted. He was killed by the troops that were escorting him into Holland. The report is confirmed by the Hague correspondent of the German news agency at Munich.
