Germany's Debt to France.

CYRIL COOL WRITES OF SOLDIER LIFE IN FRANCE.

Writing from a point in France, Cyril Cool, Co. C, M. G. Bn., in a letter to the home folks says: "I've been over for a month or more now and find France a good deal different than the states, especially along transportation lines.

Everything from a dog, donkey, oxen, push-carts, bicycles, horses and motor cars ranging in size from one not quite as large as an American baby-buggy to a fairly good-sized touring car or truck.

The vineyards are altogether different than I always imagined they were. In place of having the vines growing tall and winding around over a frame-work of some kind, as the only ones I ever saw in the States, they are kept trimmed down to about three or four feet in height and are laid out in more orderly rows than an American cornfield.

"We spent a short time in England, as you probably know from my previous letters. The trip across the channel was the worst part of our voyage as it is certainly a rough stretch of water and the boat, or rather canoe, in which we crossed certainly was worse than any broncho ever heard of.

The dispatches of the last few days tell of the departure of Food Administrator Hoover across the sea to supervise the distribution of food to the war-stricken countries. He also urges the people of this great country to still conserve and to save.
