Unloading Stamps and Bonds.

"Too many war savings stamps are being cashed by people who evidently are not compelled to cash them," said Postmaster McEvoy yesterday. "If it was a patriotic duty to buy them, continued Mr. McEvoy, 'it is a patriotic duty to hold them until they become due, for the government needs money just as badly now as a year ago.' Not only are holders of savings stamps cashing them, but many local holders of bonds are disposing of them at a discount. Unless holders of these securities are absolutely forced to part with them they make mistake in doing so, for they are a good investment and by retaining them the holders assist their government in a time when the resources of the country must be guarded. You may think that parting with your \$100 or may make no difference, but if two or five million other people do the same thing you can easily see the result."

Chaplin Disguise Too Natural For Huns To Resist.

An example of practical camouflage is given by Charlie Chaplin in his second million-dollar picture, "Shoulder Arms," to be shown at the Keith theatre on January 17th and 18th when he disguises himself as a tree stump and starts on a spying trip into enemy territory, only to be met by a small party of Huns, seeking firewood, who promptly decide to chop down the human stump as an addition to the load of wood they are about to take back to their trenches. In Charlie's opinion, his attempt at camouflage is entirely too successful, and his resentment over the stupidity of the Huns in mistaking him for a genuine stump gets him into countless difficulties.

Civil War in Berlin.

Berlin is in a state of complete anarchy and civil war has begun. All the banks are barricaded and a great number of the public buildings are in the hands of the Spartacus, or extreme radical group. Thousands of armed workmen of the Spartacus faction, the correspondent reports, are crowding the streets and at several points firing has begun. The sound of machine gun fire could be heard from all parts of Berlin.

THRESHING OUT GOVERNMENT OWNERSHIP OF RAILROADS.

Back at Washington one of the absorbing and all-important questions before the house and senate is the government ownership of railroads. The proposition of government ownership, has many friends, and quite a few of those who do not want federal ownership are favorable to government control. At the senate investigation hearing this week Edgar E. Clark, chairman of the Interstate railroad commission, advocated immediate return of the roads, while Director General McAdoo asked that the return to private ownership be made only at the end of the time prescribed by law, thereby enabling the increased freight rates to pay off the deficit incurred by government ownership.

Senator Cummings, of Iowa, has formulated a plan which favors continuation of government ownership and the leasing of the various roads out to individual corporations all closely watched by the government. A board, new member of cabinet or a railroad administrator for the government would be appointed, under this plan, to watch over all of the roads thus leased out. The plan is being discussed favorably inasmuch as it advocates continued ownership by the government.

Sale of Duroc Jerseys.

Monday, January 20th Frank Strollberg and P. O. Johnson will have a sale of Duroc Jersey brood sows at the North Side barn. These two growers will offer sixty-one head of registered animals, bred to five different head boards, and forming a draft the like of which has never been offered for sale in North Platte.

Hog growers of Lincoln county have been slow to recognize the real value of well-bred animals; many of them holding to the view that "a hog is a hog," neglectful of the proven fact that the well-bred animal is the prosperity producer. If this were not true, the value of well-bred animals would never have been established.

This sale by Messrs. Strollberg and Johnson is an effort to interest growers in producing better hogs, to give them a start on the road toward making money out of hog growing. The animals to be sold will be brot in on the Saturday preceding the sale and can be seen at the barn prior to the sale.
