



DISHES THAT SAVE EGGS.

A dish to save eggs need not mean that eggs are to be entirely eliminated. for we need the nutri-

ment of this valuable food even when as highpriced as eggs are at the present time. The thrifty housewife has been beforehunded and has packed a supply of eggs in water-glass during the summer or early fall,

when eggs could be purchased at a reasonable price. Eggs packed carefully may be used as fresh eggs.

A dish which takes the place of scrambled eggs, is less expensive and quite nutritive is the following: Cook a quarter of a cupful of rice in an omelet pan until a light yellow with any sweet fat, stirring often to keep it from scorehing. When of a good color, broth or water may be added. with seasoning. Cook the rice until perfectly tender. Just before time to serve add a half cupful of milk and an egg or two; stir until well scrambled and serve at once.

Honey Drop Cakes-Cream a half cupful of shortening and add a half cupful of sugar, one cupful of honey. a beaten egg yolk and a tablespoonful of lemon juice and a pinch of salt. Mix well and add three cupfuls of flour white of egg.

SOME CHOICE RECIPES.
