Obituary.

Charles G. Dick, oldest son of Mr P. Dick, was born at Pattsmouth, Neb., on Sept. 30th, 1878 and came to Lincoln county with his parents two years later, remaining here until nearly sixteen. At that age he went to Sidney with his father where he attended and graduated from the high school, leaving the next year for Montana. He was working as a printer at Kalispel when at the outbreak of the Spanish American war he enlisted in the First Montana Regiment which was sent to the Phillipines and remained there for nearly three years in active service.

On his return to this country and to civilian life he located in California where he engaged in district reclamation work, rising from an assistant to the captain's position on the dredge. For the past ten years he had been working in various parts of central California on many reclamation projects. For the last three years and at the time of his death he was captain of a dredge for the Dutton Dredge Co. of San Francisco.

He died Sunday afternoon, Jan. 5 1919, at Martinez, Calif., of bronchial pregementa and influenza. Funeral services were held on Monday. Jan. 13th, from the home of his brother L. B. Dick of this city, Rev. J. H. Curry of the Presbyterian church officiating, and interment made in the local cemetery.

He was a member of the Masons, 32nd degree, the L. O. O. F., and the Knights of Pythlam He leaves to mourn him his mother, Mrs. C. P. Dick, two brothers Loonard and Fred. now in service overseas, and sister Eva all of this city.


