An Insult to the Uniform.

Mr. Secretary Baker, you have ordered the immediate release of 113 men who had been mustered into the service of the United States, but who had refused to fight.

Have you considered the significance of what you have done? The American people have just fought through a great war. Millions of men have put on the uniform and have risked their lives or stood ready to risk their lives. A multitude have come home maimed and blind. Other tens of thousands have made the supreme sacrifice and will never return.

These men have been fighting for all that men hold dear. They have been fighting for their homes, their women and children.

In contrast has been a little group of slackers—of men who would not fight. If the nation had been made up to them, if they had constituted even a respectable group, Germany would now be supreme in the world. A nation of these conscientious objectors would never have sent out the men who died on the Tuscany, who stopped the German rush at Chateau Thierry, who fell in the Argonne.

You have ordered 113 of them returned to the citizenship they deserted, which they have refused to lift a finger to protect. You have ordered them given an honorable discharge.

An honorable discharge! The same discharge given the man who has bared his breast to the German bullets, under your order they will come back to vote and enjoy the privileges that others laid down their lives to save.

By this act you have put a premium on cowardice. You have rewarded evasion of duty. You are permitting these men to return to their homes even in advance of the fighting men of the camps.

Can you believe, Mr. Secretary, that in this action you have correctly interpreted the spirit of that America which has given its sons and its all to the great cause of freedom?

NEW PHONE RULINGS ARE NOW EFFECTIVE.

New regulations governing long distance phone calls have been put in effect here, in accordance with the orders issued by Postmaster General Burleson. By this order long distance phone calls over the entire country are placed on a uniform basis, while no change is made in the local service rates.

The principal change made in long distance service is that it is now classified instead of coming under one head. There is a special charge for "station to station" service, another when a certain individual is wanted on the phone, another for appointment, night calls and the like.

The basis for all charges on long distance calls, under the new system, is on the "station to station" rate, which is determined by the air line distance between the two towns. The rate is computed for the initial period of conservation on the basis of five cents for each six miles up to twenty-four miles and five cents for each eight miles beyond that distance.

Boys Receive Membership Buttons.

During the past week all boys who registered in the U. S. Boys' Working Reserve received their enrollment buttons. The total number of boys between sixteen and twenty who registered was 162 and of this number 105 live in North Platte. All but twenty of the boys received their parents' signified willingness to engage in an essential occupation under the direction of the Boys' Working Reserve.

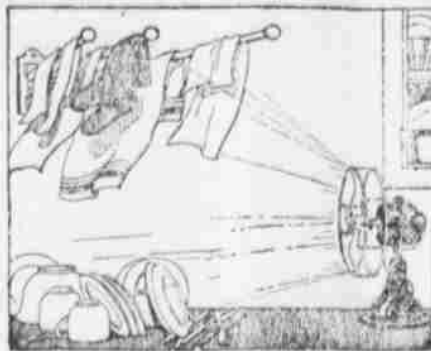
Boys who have failed to receive their enrollment button can have the same by calling at the Franklin school during school hours.
