SOME INCOME TAX FORMS READY FOR DELIVERY.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 18.—Individuals with incomes of \$5,000 or less may now obtain income tax return forms at offices of revenue collectors or banks, the revenue bureau announced today.

The individual form for incomes of \$5,000 or less is a printed sheet divided into three parts, one constituting a "work sheet" on which a taxpayer may figure his income according to the guide provided, another containing detailed instructions and the third being the actual return form.

Says Armies Must Hold On.

Washington, D. C.—Roger E. Simmons, who recently returned from a mission to Russia for the bureau of commerce, Monday told the senate committee investigating lawless agitation in this country that if the American and allied forces were withdrawn from northern Russia the Bolsheviks would engage in one of the bloodiest massacres the world had ever seen.

The witness said he was surprised at the demands being made for the withdrawal of the American forces, and told the committee that every time the American and allied soldiers had found it necessary to give up ground in northern Russia, the Bolsheviks had swept in and inaugurated an orgy of murder of peaceful citizens.

PREMIER OF FRANCE SHOT BY ASSASSIN.

Paris, Feb. 19.—Georges Clemenceau, the French premier, was struck three times by bullets in an attempt to assassinate him today.

One bullet entered the right shoulder and lodged under the left shoulder, missing the spinal cord and the lungs.

The other two bullets caused scarcely more than abrasions of the skin on the right arm and right hand.

Two bullets passed through the clothing of the premier.

In all, seven shots were fired at the premier, point blank by the assassin, Emile Cottin, known in anarchist circles as "Milou," who was arrested directly after the shooting.

A second arrest in connection with the shooting was made by the police. The prisoner, named Dreyfus, protested his innocence and said he had been there a spectator of the shooting.

He resides near the premier's home.

Must Make Good All Damage.

Paris.—An agreement has almost been reached by the peace conference delegates as to what extent of the war costs Germany must bear.

It is understood that the associated powers delegates will not ask Germany to pay the allied war debt, but that she must make good every damage done by her military forces in every country where the latter transgressed.

This is the substance of further discussion.

Terms Coming Harder Daily.

Paris.—The allied armistice terms, which have been signed by Germany, are said to make it absolutely impossible for that country to undertake any new military operations not actioned by the allied nations.
