Burial of Private Raymond Burgner

My dear Friend:— I am writing you this letter because I happen to have had the sad duty of burying, at Evacuation Hospital No. 9 in France, Private Raymond Burgner, who died of pneumonia and was buried October 21, 1918, in grave No. 206.

There is little that I can tell you, but I imagine that every detail is of interest, and in any case I want to send you my sincerest sympathy in your bereavement.

You have probably learned before this considerable about his death. He was brought to our hospital at Vaubeau, which was directly behind the Argonne Forest, where, I can assure you, he received the best possible medical attention. So far as I was able, I tried to minister to the many brave soldiers that were brought to us during the sad days of October. I regret I was able to do so little for him, but can at least give you the consolation of knowing that he had a decent Christian burial and that his body lies in a lovely, quiet little cemetery on the top of a hill overlooking the town of Vaubeau.

Not long ago while addressing the American troops, Bishop Brent said there was no decoration so high as the wooden cross placed at the head of a man's grave, and you happen to have that distinction in your family, with what comfort it may bring.

Although I realize very keenly how inadequate any words of mine are to bring comfort to you, may I close in once more assuring you that if there is any way that I can be of further service to you I would consider it a privilege.

Regulations governing the payment of \$50 bonus to honorably discharged soldiers were amended by the war department to permit the acceptance by disbursing officials of a "true copy" of discharge certificates. Heretofore the original certificates were required, but it was found that many soldiers refused to part with the papers, preferring to lose the bonus rather than risk the loss of official evidence of their honorable release.

Cigarette Bill Passes

The legislature has at last arranged to take the ban off the selling of cigarettes except to minors. While passing this bill the senate tacked on a few amendments that will give some consolation to the foes of the coffin nail. After the bill becomes a law along in the middle of the summer it will be unlawful to smoke cigarettes in public eating places. The advertising of cigarettes in public places, except newspapers, is forbidden. The law also aims at the drugging of the tobacco and paper used in cigarette making.
