The Victory Liberty Loan, to be offered by the Treasury Department to the people for their subscription next month, will represent the price this country is to pay for the victory which is the hope of all true lovers of liberty...

The enemy well knew we had mobilized and were training enough of the same kind of soldiers to double our fighting force in Europe by early spring. They knew we were manufacturing guns, shells, gas, airplanes and tanks...

The Germans knew this meant not only defeat but annihilation. All this in history now. The fighting is over and the boys are coming home. They are coming home proud of their glorious achievements to drop back into civilian life and to enjoy "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness" guaranteed to all American citizens...

Our boys over there on the battle lines well knew the loss of human life, the sufferings of the wounded, and the hardships the war had cost. They went over there to win and would willingly have stuck by the job another year if necessary to win a victory for peace, and peace was what they were fighting for.

Therefore they are in position to know how much of human life was spared, how much of sorrow and broken homes and heart aches was saved by the winning of the war in November, 1918, instead of in May, 1919.

GOVERNMENT EXTRAVAGANCE.

Any private enterprise conducted on the financial plan of the United States government would be bankrupt in a few weeks. The only thing that saves the government of the United States from bankruptcy is the willingness of the people to submit to any burden of taxation which Congress sees fit to impose.

Nothing will contribute more to the confidence of the people in their government than the adoption of business principles in the spending of their money. The time must come, and soon, when the different branches of the government will make up in advance and submit to scrutiny estimates of their needs, and will be confined to such allowances as the people ought to be required to furnish and expenditures in excess will be dealt with as violations of the law.
