#### Railroads Loss Over Billion

To finance the railroads for the balance of this year and to pay the government's operating loss for sixteen months up to the month, an appropriation of \$1,200,000,000 has been asked of congress by Director General Hines. More may be sought later if the government continues to lose heavily. The \$1,200,0000,000 is in addition to the \$500,000,000 appropriated by the last congress, and includes the \$750, 000,000 which failed of appropriation. Out of this appropriation railroads will be paid the sums due them months ago as standard compensation, and for which they have accepted the railroad administration's certificates of indebtedness. On security of these certificates they have borrowed from banks and the war finance corporation to meet their current corporate obligations.

Approximately \$486,000,000 represents the government's loss in operating the railroads from January 1, 1918, when private control ended, to May 1. This is the difference between the sums for which the government is obligated to pay the roads on contracts and the net actual operating income from operations.
