DISINTEGRATION OF GERMANY STARTED BY SECESSION

A situation which may effect the peace settlement with Germany has arisen through the proclamation of an independent republic of the Rhine province, stretching along the frontiers of Holland, Belgium and Luxemburg and extending from the lowlands along the Dutch border to the hills of the Saar.

If the Rhineland province becomes independent, a buffer state will be set up between Germany and France and Belgium, the Saar region will be in the control of the new state and Germany will have lost all her possessions west of the Rhine.

WANTS STATE TO PAY FOR CORN DUCKS ATE

TWENTY-FIVE SOLDIERS HURT IN A WRECK AT ASHLAND.

Two hundred and seventy-six casualties, including five officers and one Y. M. C. A. secretary, members of the 557th Hoboken casual company, narrowly escaped death when five of the coaches bearing them to Presidio, San Francisco, plunged down a 20-foot embankment about a half mile east of Ashland, Neb., at 1:30 Sunday morning.
