A resident of Hall precinct said the reason the voters of that precinct voted solidly against the court house was because "they wouldn't give them good roads," and the same plea was made by a resident of Dickens precinct where the vote was ninety-three against and none for the court house. The Tribune has quite a bunch of subscribers in both Dickens and Hall precincts and the editor invites one or more of them to tell him just what connection there is between bad roads and a new court house. The residents of these precincts know, or should know, that the law limits the levy for roads, that each of these two precincts receive their full share of road work in proportion to the tax they pay and to demand more than their share would be unfair and unjust to other precincts. It is an utter impossibility to have good roads in every precinct under the road revenue law as it now stands, because there are 1400 miles of roads in Lincoln county and revenue for road purposes is less than \$25,000 a year. Here in North Platte the business men raised a fund of six thousand dollars to be spent on road maintenance within a radius of six or eight miles of North Platte for the year 1919. Some of these men contributed a hundred dollars each, and yet they seldom use the roads. Are the farmers of Dickens and Hall precincts each willing to donate fifty or one hundred dollars worth of work on their own roads—on the roads which they are constantly using and which they say are in such bad condition? If the funds do not permit the commissioners to help you, why don't you help yourself. We have been told that farmers often refuse to get out to drag the roads, though they are fairly well paid for the work, and this certainly shows an utter lack of the good roads spirit. It is possible—it is even probable that some day the farmers will demand that county bonds be voted for good roads or that a general levy for good roads be made on all the taxable property of the county. When that time comes we want to assure the people of not only Dickens and Hall precincts but of every precinct in the county that the Tribune will support the proposition and will use its best endeavor to give the good roads bonds or levy a majority as overwhelming as was majority in North Platte on the court house levy. North Platte is part of Lincoln county and it has never yet failed to stand up to the rack when an issue that concerned the good of the whole county was placed before it.

The railroads of the United States hauled 4,276,949 troops on special and regular trains for an average of 660 miles each in the first six months of 1919 according to statistics made public by Director General Hines. In addition approximately 2,000,000 officers and men made railway trips when on furlough and another million were transported from camps to their homes after discharge, making a total of 7,250,000 military passengers accommodated in addition to civilian travel. The military traffic in six months required 9,000,000 train miles. The five mill levy for a new court house in Richardson county, this state, the election for which was held Saturday, the proposition carried by four votes. The close vote on the levy was due to a fight between Falls City and Humbolt as to whether the former town shall remain the county seat. Since the vote on the court house levy Humbolt has filed a petition asking for an election as to whether the county seat shall be moved to Humbolt. The election will be held on September 9th. The fight is very bitter.

Dick Shinkle, living northwest of Hershey, who transacted business in town yesterday, says he lost twenty acres of beets through the ravages of the worms. This land he plowed up and planted to cane. He says grasshoppers are working strong on the second crop of alfalfa.

HOUSEHOLDER MAY KEEP LIQUOR FOR OWN USE.

Under the national prohibition bill passed by the lower house of Congress Tuesday it is not illegal to have in one's possession liquor in a private dwelling while the same is occupied and used by the possessor as his private dwelling, and the liquor is used for personal consumption by the owner, his family or his guests. The possessor of such liquors, however, bears the burden of proof that the liquor was acquired and is possessed lawfully.

Intoxicating liquor is defined as a beverage containing more than 4 1/2 per cent of alcohol. Any house, boat, vehicle, or other place where liquor is manufactured or sold is declared a nuisance. No person shall manufacture, sell, barter, give away, transport, import, export, deliver, furnish or receive any intoxicating liquors. Liquor for non-beverage purposes, and wine for sacramental use may be sold under specified regulations.

News Notes. Great Britain Tuesday placed her approval on the peace treaty with Germany. The treaty was ratified by a vote of 163 for and 4 against. An attack was made on the peace terms by way of bringing up the Irish question and it was through this move that a unanimous vote was lost. Member Devlin again asked that Ireland be made a plebiscite, but Lloyd George held that the Irish people must first learn to know themselves.

Engineer Thomas Carroll, Fireman A. H. Woods and Head Breakman Charles Hobbs, the entire crew of an extra Union Pacific train No. 5008, were instantly killed at 4:15 o'clock Monday morning near Castle Rock, Utah, when the boiler of the engine exploded. The bodies of the three men were taken to Evanston, Wyo., on a special relief train.

Over six hundred divorce cases have been filed in the courts at Des Moines within the past six months. One divorce is filed against every three marriage licenses issued. Hosts of war marriages are said to be responsible.

Twenty-five hundred military prisoners in the disciplinary barracks at the federal prison at Leavenworth, Kansas, went on strike Tuesday and resisted attempts of the guards to force them to work. Colonel Frederick Rice in command of the barracks, received a committee of 12 prisoners, who asked that the men be given shorter hours and more to eat. When the men were ordered from their cells Tuesday practically all of them refused and guards who later attempted to force the men from their cells were beaten back.

Ralph T. Moyer, cashier of the North Penn Bank, of Philadelphia, which was suspended last week by the state banking commission confessed Tuesday that the shortage of the bank would approximate \$900,000. The frauds, according to the commissioners' information had been going on for two years. The state bank examiners were unable to detect them because, according to Moyer's confession, loose leaves were substituted by him in the books and ledgers when the examiners came around. The substitutes did not disclose any discrepancies.
