To the Voters of Lincoln County, Neb. North Platte, Neb., Oct. 25, 1919. An election will be held on November 4th, to elect delegates to a CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION.

On account of my experience during three sessions of the legislature and the position I have taken on important public questions, many persons urged me to become a candidate for this convention.

Because of the tremendous problems growing out of the war, and the growth of profiteering in this country, there is a tendency on behalf of some of the radical elements to drift our country's progress toward socialism, anarchy and bolshevism.

I believe that the safety of our government and our state lies in a middle course. We must not let bolshevism and anarchy get control of the American people.

Because of this belief, in the last legislature, I opposed the Civil Administrative Code bill which was passed and which placed all of the powers of administration of the government of the state in the hands of the governor.

Our constitution has stood the test of years. During troublesome times is no period for trying experiments in new things in constitutions.

I also believe that our wealth is in the native soil, and that the title to our lands should only be held by citizens of the United States and if elected to the convention, I will endeavor

to see that this is placed in our constitution.

If you believe that my legislative experience will be of service to our county and state in the coming constitutional convention and that the principles for which I stand are correct, I would be pleased to have your support at the election.
