EVENTS IN NORTH PLATTE THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO

(From The Tribune April 4, 1885.)
The North half of the old barracks block on west Front street was sold by Thos. Hughes to H. Otten for \$1,700.

Mrs. Marie Nauman, mother of Geo. Nauman, died of dropsy at the age of sixty-eight years.
Mrs. J. W. Ridgway, now Mrs. B. B. Baker, was expected to arrive in town and assist with the Easter music at the Episcopal church.

Richard Bascombe and his wife, living four miles northeast of town, were cremated in their home. Both bodies were burned beyond recognition.

A big case had been tried in the district court, the setting aside of a partnership between W. S. Braugh and Bernard Beer which involved \$90,000. The plaintiff, Braugh, won out, restoring to him \$49,000 worth of cattle as well as a note of \$9,000 in which Beer claimed a half interest.

Thirty-two prairie schooners, bound for Keith court, passed through town during one afternoon. They were families who were to locate on homesteads.

In Nebraska, the most serious opposition to Hoover is found among the farmers who blame the food administration for the failure of the price of hogs and remain on the schedule of thirteen bushels of corn for 100 pounds of pork originally fixed.
