City Election Today.

The municipal election is being held today, the polls opening at nine o'clock this morning and will remain open until seven this evening. Women can exercise their suffrage, and it is probable that quite a number will do so.

The only contests are for councilmen in the First, Second and Third wards. In the First ward Ray Cantlin, James Smallwood and W. W. Cumming oppose each other, in the Second ward Jake Smith and Elmer Coates are the opponents, and in the Third ward Ralph Hansen and P. J. Diener oppose each other. Sanford Hartman, candidate for councilman in the Third ward to fill a vacancy, has no opposition, neither has C. H. Leininger in the Fourth. E. R. Goodman and Ed Diekey, candidates for school board are unopposed.

Working Out A System.

Nebraska is turning out highway markers at the rate of about three hundred each day. These signs have various inscriptions, such as "mile distance," "danger," "county line" and the like. They are to be erected along all federal and state aid roads. The signs are costing about three dollars each, this sum including price of posts. It is planned to have sufficient signs ready by the first of May to cover the entire system of roads over the state. The signs are to be bolted on both steel and wooden posts and five hundred of the steel posts will be embedded in concrete. These signs are made from the state aid road funds available.

Long Distance Telephone Service Has Been Restored.

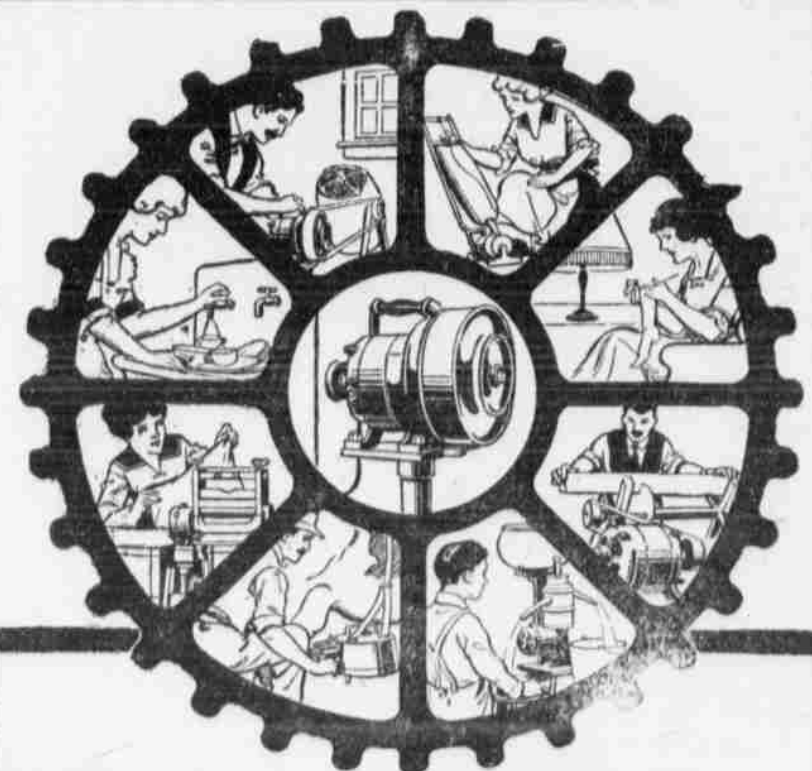
Nearly every town in Nebraska, South Dakota, Iowa and Minnesota to which telephone service was cut off by last Sunday's storm can now be reached over the long distance telephone lines.

Temporary wires have been strung on all lines to provide emergency service.

Some long distance calls may be delayed because it will be necessary to send them over emergency routes, until the permanent lines are rebuilt.

But more than ten thousand poles and crossarms, hundreds of miles of copper wire, and other supplies were sent immediately to the damaged areas and nearly one thousand repairmen are now at work restoring permanent lines.
