# GOOD ROADS

## MORAL NECESSITY TO BUILD

### To Maintain Happy and Prosperous People on Farms We Must Improve Rural Conditions.

(By J. DENNY O'NEIL, Pennsylvania Highway Commissioner.)

The problem confronting the highway department in these abnormal times when labor and material are so scarce and so high, is this: Shall we go ahead constructing new roads? I am convinced that good roads are an economic as well as a moral necessity. We must have food, and if we want boys and girls to stay on the farm to produce it, we must dig them out of the mud by building roads so they can get to market or to a railroad.

There are places in Pennsylvania where it costs more to haul farm products to a railroad station than it does to pay the freight to France. As in the past, the hope of the future from a moral point of view, is to maintain a happy, contented and prosperous people on the farms and in the small towns and villages. They don't produce I. W. W.'s, ballot-box stuffers, election fraud crooks, gun-

men and commercialized vice on the farms. These are the exclusive products of the cities, and if we want to keep the people away from the cities, we must give them good roads and do what we can to improve living conditions in rural communities.

### FARMERS ARE BEHIND ROADS

National Grange Officers Confer With Senator Townsend on Bill He Has Introduced.

Proceeding in accordance with instructions given them at the annual meeting of the National Grange, held recently in Grand Rapids, Mich., Washington representatives of the organization, which comprises some 700,000 farmers, have conferred with Senator Charles E. Townsend of Michigan and will hold further meetings with him on the measures which he has introduced in Congress providing for a national highway system to be built and maintained by the government under the direction of a federal commission.

In a special report adopted at the grange meeting, it was held that the time has come when, with due regard for the present and future necessities for permanent, hard-surfaced highways, all the highway activities of the national government should be unified in a single administrative department under such limitation of powers as will secure the greatest possible degree of efficiency and economy in the expenditure of national funds.

### VITAL IMPORTANCE OF ROADS

Modern Medicine Points Out There Are Few Physicians and Nurses in Rural Communities.

That good roads are of vital importance to the health of a community and particularly those who live in rural communities is shown in an article in Modern Medicine. It is pointed out by the writer that there are few physicians, few nurses, and practically no hospital facilities in rural districts. In some communities, even in older states, there is only one practicing physician to 1,500 population. Hardships of travel make young physicians scarce. Better highways, he points out, will lead physicians to go after country practice in increasing numbers.

### HIGHWAY WORK IN WYOMING

Now Under Way \$2,500,000 Worth of Federal Aid Improvements—More to Follow.

There are now under way in Wyoming \$2,500,000 worth of federal aid highway improvements. These improvements are the first ones of a program contemplating the expenditure of \$6,000,000 in three years.

### THREE PRINCIPAL DIVISIONS

Due Consideration Must Be Given to Location to Reduce Cost of Maintenance.

The three principal divisions of actual road making are location, construction and maintenance. In planning a road it is necessary that we take into consideration all three of these steps, since proper location affects the cost of construction and may materially reduce cost of maintenance.

SUMMER time will see some of the most beautiful wraps that have ever been made under the inspiration of its sunny skies. They are placed at each side on a panel and at the waistline on one side.

Another wrap of taffeta has a deep yoke with a full cape gathered to it under a hand of embroidery. Black taffeta was chosen for this cape with embroidery in sapphire blue and blue satin lining. It was shorter than the wrap pictured.

THE outstanding excellence of children's clothes for spring lies mostly in their simplicity and their neatness, and neatness in children's apparel is another name for smartness. Leaving furbelows to party frocks, designers have taken blue serge, plaid woolsens and many substantial cotton goods and turned them into enchanting things for little girls to spend their days in.

For the younger girls serge dresses with bloomers to match or with bloomers of plaid material leave nothing to be desired in dresses for everyday wear. Detachable white collars and cuffs of linen or heavy cottons or flannel, start the little maid off in the morning properly freshened up for school. When the weather is warm a pretty chambray or gingham dress replaces serge for daily wear. The care and the success with which they have been designed is convincingly shown in the box-plated school dress of chambray pictured above at the right.

It is a one-piece dress with plain body, elbow sleeves and box-plated skirt. It is fitted with a deep vestee and white collar and cuffs, these edged with a very narrow braid or lace that look like tatting. The plain belt, with flat pockets set over it at the sides, is made of the chambray.

But school and play do not fill all the time and small girls must sometimes be daintily dressed for other affairs—as visits and parties. They have been provided for with frocks of pretty cotton goods, like organdie or dimity or lawn. Plain organdie in yellow with collar, pockets and sash of white organdie are displayed in one of these dress-up frocks as pictured above.
