EVENTS IN NORTH PLATTE THIRTY-FIVE YEARS AGO

(From The Tribune May 8, 1885.)
 W. B. Conklin had erected a revolving fountain to water his lawn, this fountain being in the shape of an Enterprise windmill. The city water system had not been installed at this time.

A cold wave passed over the county and ice a half inch thick was formed on water standing in outdoor pails. Hundreds of sunfish and catfish were being caught in Lamplugh's lake by North Platte fishermen. The lake was overburdened with fish and the owner asked fishermen to help clean them out.

An accident occurred three miles west of town and thirteen freight cars went in the ditch. It required several days to gather up the wreckage. Arrangements were being made for a proper observance of Decoration Day. Colonel Morrow, commandant at Ft. Sidney, had accepted an invitation to deliver an address.

Col. Jimmie Cannon accidentally shot himself through the right leg. The Colonel claimed that while he slumbered some one stole \$50 of his money. Getting drunk at the expense of friends he pulled his gun and waving it around he told how he would perforate the thief with holes should he find him, the gun slipped from his hand, was discharged and the ball entered the Colonel's leg. Dr. Donaldson gave the necessary medical aid.

County Judge T. C. Patterson bound A. Stolle over to the district court on a charge of getting away with a bond which he had given to W. E. Beach as a guarantee of his faithful work as a bank clerk.

Del Huntington, who was conducting a restaurant on Front street, guaranteed the public the best meat obtainable in town.

John Burke returned from the Big Horn country where he selected a ranch site for M. Burke & Sons, who later moved 6,000 head of cattle from the Dismal to the new ranch.

Miss Ella Schultz, of St. Joe, was the guest of Miss Minnie Bolton, and her stay of several weeks was marked by many parties, dances and picnics. Engine No. 70, which had been nicknamed Maude S. by reason of her speed, had gone into the shops for repairs. Engine 829, the largest passenger engine that had ever been turned out of the North Platte shops completely new, was given a trial trip. The Tribune said "the monster is a credit to Master Mechanic McConnell and the employees of the shops."

Engineers Tracy, Austin, Hill and Stuart will well remember both Maude S. and the 829.

New Pension Pay.
 Information from Saltzgeber, Commissioner of Pensions, Washington, D. C. has been received from which I quote as follows:

Fuller Pension bill signed by the President May 1, 1920. Soldiers of the Civil war and war with Mexico now on the pension roll will receive per month \$50.00; blind or totally disabled, \$72.00; widows married prior to 1905 and now drawing pension, \$30.00. Payments at the increased rate will be made July 4, 1920. No applications necessary except for those entitled to pensions above \$50.00, such as the blind or helpless requiring personal aid and attendance.
