Discuss Swimming Pool.

Members of the Welfare Association and the Park Board held a meeting Tuesday evening and discussed the swimming pool proposition. Hershey Welch, who had made an examination and study of the proposed pool at the city park made a report in which he stated that owing to the contour of the park ground the bottom of the proposed pool could not be drained, and as stagnant water would result the location of a pool at that point was abandoned.

Mr. Welch had, however, also prepared a sketch of the city sand pit north of the Country Club grounds which he thought might be used not only as a swimming pool, but also for boating and for skating in the winter. This pit is about the size of two city blocks, could be easily drained, and by the purchase of additional land for beach purposes might be converted into a city bathing and boating resort. This pit will be investigated thoroughly as to its possibilities and if found feasible the city will be asked to declare it as part of the city's park possessions.

Woman Dies on Train.

Mrs. Wm. Grace, seventy-five years of age and resident of Vermillion, S. D., died on train No. 19 Wednesday morning a short distance east of this city. The body was taken to the Berryberry & Forbes undertaking rooms, prepared for burial and taken back to Vermillion yesterday. Mrs. Grace, accompanied by her husband, was enroute to California.

RAYBURN REVIVAL MEETINGS ARE GROWING IN INTEREST.

The Rayburn-Wickland evangelistic campaign is progressing with a steadiness that promises to grow into a live interest. James Rayburn is an evangelist of constant success. He has learned the secret of successful religious campaigns. His devoted life and indefatigable labor will most certainly win here.

Another feature of the meetings is the fine choir leadership of Mr. Wickland. He is a fine soloist as well as leader. The choir, besides leading the congregational singing, is learning some beautiful anthems from the "Chorus Choir Selections" of E. O. Excell. The book used in the congregational singing is "Songs of the Great Salvation" by W. M. Runyan and D. B. Towner. This is a book of many new songs that are rapidly becoming popular.

Mr. Rayburn is not afraid to speak the truth. He strikes straight from the shoulder in a forceful undemonstrative manner that makes people think. He has an interesting way of putting the old truths of the Gospel in new ways. Moses, for instance, chose to herd sheep for forty years and then herd goats (meaning Israel) for the next forty years. He could have chosen royalty with its luxury and power and perhaps made a mummy at which people would now gaze in the British Museum. But he chose God's way and fifteen hundred years later met with Christ on the mountain. How much better off was he then than Pharaoh?

He honors the name of Christ making evident again and again that Christ alone has power to forgive sins. He is the only legal tenure in heaven. Where there is no Christ there is heathenism. Note for instance the difference between this country and that country across the Rio Grande the difference between the Pilgrim fathers and the Turks. This difference is Christ. The chaos of Russia to-day is the result of a dead ecclesiasticism with no Christ. It is this spirit of Christ's missionaries that has pioneered civilization among cannibals. It was not Singer sewing machine salesmen nor any other kind of salesman that became the martyrs. It was Missionaries.

Mr. Rayburn teaches emphatically that we want a religion to live by. Death bed repentance has no appeal for him. Don't send for him on your death bed. It is easy to be pious when preachers and doctors and nurses are around. It is the real thing to live Christ out on the railroad and hear the reproaches of men.

Mr. Rayburn has no use for the insipid, exemplary, limited ideas of Christ that are taught now in so many pulpits. He believes in a Christ that has the same power today as when the church was founded. We have heard a good deal since the war of a new gospel for a new age. This is not true. The age is not new. Men have their same old sins as they did in Christ's time. Christ never changes. We need the same Christ today as always.

Mr. Rayburn does not fall to give the devil his due. This thing many ministers fail to do. The devil peddles all kinds of lies about us. He likes to make back-sliders think that Christ don't love you any more. He never fails to slander Christ. But the Bible says "Christ loves them unto the end." Money, to Mr. Rayburn, is not the chief end in life. He told of his boyhood friend that died in Hot Springs poor. He had wealth in oil, property and was president of a large bank. He could have written his check for \$100,000 as easily as the evangelist could have written one for five dollars. He had wealth but he died poor. He knew not the Christ.

Again he believes in a doctrine that knows what it means. Doctrine he tells us is just teaching. We all have some sort of a doctrine. But many have such a weak doctrine regarding Christ that they couldn't recognize teaching that denies the divinity of Christ. We must give a reason for the faith that is within us. Too many are led by every wind of doctrine and every spiritual sleight-of-hand performance.

God is not at fault because we are indifferent and sinners. He is ready at all times to forgive and come into the christian's life. He fails to come in because we don't want him. We do the things we want to. We have time for pleasure, for shows, for clubs, but no time for Christ. Teachers go before their classes unprepared because they want to do something else and make the excuse of no time. We have time for the things we want to do even here in North Platte.

A feature of Mr. Rayburn's meetings is the afternoon Bible classes. These meet at 2:30 and are not over an hour in length. The Bible is studied devotionally and with a view of teaching a constructive understanding of Christ's great program. It is not a critical or literary study of God's word but a vital, spiritual and doctrinal study of a life giving revelation of God.

Federal Court Convenes Monday.

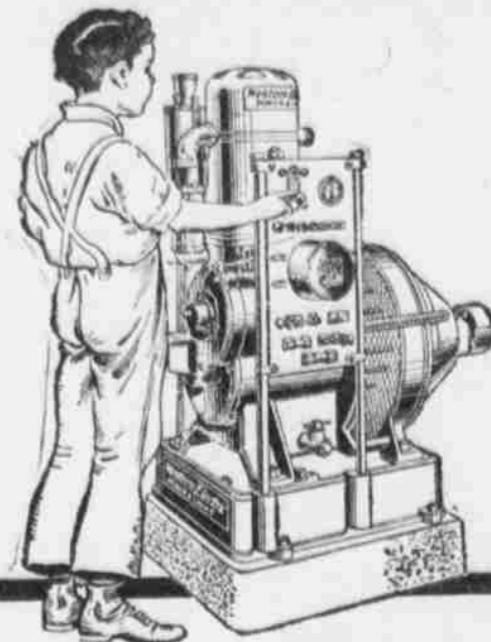
