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LABOR BOARD TO DECIDE

DECISION JULY 20th
Last Friday the railroad labor board gave out an announcement that a decision will be announced on and possibly before July 20th, and that the rate of increase as announced will be effective on and as of May 1st, 1920.

New York Scouts Hike Thru Town
DeForest Jones, Deputy Commissioner of the Williamsburg District, Brooklyn, New York, and Joseph O'Farrell, Assistant Scoutmaster of Troop 94, Brooklyn, New York, are hiking thru to San Francisco by way of the Lincoln Highway.

They have a full charge of enthusiasm for the Boy Scout work and told us the following about the work in the east.
"Principals of the public schools claim that the Scout movement has worked wonder with the boys. Many of our Mayors of the eastern cities are either Scout Masters or connected with the work in some definite manner. Some of the biggest business men of the east are giving a great deal of their time, realizing that it is the greatest character building program for boys. With the great amount of foreign boys in our cities we find that it not only Americanizes the boys but the boys in turn Americanize their parents. This in turn has a great deal to do with knocking out Bolshevism. Judge James C. Cropsy, Justice of the Supreme Court, is president of our Borough Council in Brooklyn. It is the duty of the people of North Platte to get behind this movement if they want good clean, upright American young men which means so much to the nation."

There is no reason why some of the North Platte Scouts can not go to the National Convention next year and if any are qualified they might have a chance for the international meeting.

More Land for Ex-Soldiers.
Alliance—Four thousand acres of rich Garden county hay and cattle lands, part of the famous Everett Eldred ranch have been restored to homestead entry under the Kinkaid act by the government according to announcement made here by the local United States land office. The federal court at St. Louis decided in April, 1919, that the title held by Eldred to the lands was not valid and cancelled the patents on the same.

Patents will be given to ex-soldiers in filing for the homesteads which will be thrown open to entry on July 23. The soldiers' preference period will extend from July 24 to September 25 inclusive. All applications for homesteads must be accompanied by a filing fee of fourteen dollars which will be refunded if the applicant is unsuccessful. For a period of twenty days prior to July 23, soldiers may file their applications and the same will be disposed of by lot.

M., 215 feet north of a point in the center line of the Union Pacific Railroad Company, thence westerly at right angles, which said point is 176.9 feet westerly from the east line of said Section 31, measured on the center line of said track, running thence northeasterly parallel with said railroad 365.5 feet, thence southwesterly 323 feet to connect again with center line of road No. 21. The foregoing notes describe the center line of proposed road.
All objections to such vacation and establishment, or claims for damages, must be filed in the County Clerk's office of Lincoln county, Nebraska, on or before noon of the 7th day of August, A. D. 1920, or such road will be vacated and established without reference thereto.
