Another Ho Scout Activity.
Troops One and Two of the Boy Scouts have offered their services to the Cleanup Campaign Committee and have been assigned to duty as inspectors. They will cover the city, inspect the yards, alley, etc., and fill out a report on each home. Those places which pass the standard will be awarded a 100% window card and those which pass the standard will be awarded reasonable time before another inspection is made and a card awarded if the improvement is good. The Committee reports that the preliminary inspection shows many 100% homes and others hurrying to get in line.

Check County Treasurer.
C. D. Robinson, of Red Cloud, and George Anthes, of Omaha, Deputy Auditors from the State Auditor's office have just completed checking the books of the County Treasurer. They found them correct. S. M. Souder, the Treasurer reports the total collections of his office from May 29, 1919 to date to be \$1,069,694.88. This breaks all previous records for any equal length of time. "The amount of work involved in making these collections may be understood when it is known that this office issued 15,000 tax receipts last year and Lincoln County stands fourth in the state in the number of automobile receipts issued. We sent out over 5100 auto licenses in Lincoln County," said Mr. Souder.
