CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION FOR MESSENGER.

There will be an examination at the local postoffice on August 14, 1920, for messenger boy in the U. S. Weather Bureau at North Platte. Applicants must have reached their sixteenth birthday but not their eighteenth on the day of examination. The salary is \$480 a year.

ARMY TO EDUCATE ILLITERATES.

Major General Wright, Acting Chief of Staff of the United States Army has sent an order to local U. S. Army recruiting officers to enlist illiterates and non-English speaking aliens who have made legal declaration of their intent to become citizens. These will be sent to one of five new schools established by the army at designated camps, where they will be given the elements of an education in the common branches. They will then be assigned to the authorized branches of the service.

Sergeant Johnson, in charge of the local recruiting station, is pleased with this opportunity to enlarge the usefulness of the educational opportunities offered by the Army.
