Here every year many Americans and English people come to see the spot where lived not only John Robinson, William Bradford, William Brewster, and other men educated at Cambridge, but also many other British exiles mostly from the triangle between the rivers Aire and Trent and Humber, They had refused to take their religion from the English court, and had been driven from their homes into the Dutch republic, where conscience was in Holland and then salled in the Speedwell from Delfshaven to Ply-1620.


GRAY SAMARITANS RESCUING CHILDREN


