BEE KING OF NEBRASKA COMES FROM KEITH COUNTY.

C. A. Eiker, president of the Keith County Farm Bureau, has the distinction of being "bee king" of Nebraska. At present he has thirty miles of bee stands distributed up and down the South Platte river. Last year he secured something over 20,000 pounds of honey and hopes to exceed this amount the coming season due to favorable conditions. The honey is brought from the different points along the river to the Eiker refinery where it is strained and made ready for shipment. This work is done by electricity.


