CROSSINGS AND TURNINGS

Observe caution signs at schools and dangerous crossings.

 In turning corners to the Right, keep near curb.
 In turning corners to Left, go around center of street, keep to the right of center of street and near curb.
 Give right of way to vehicles approaching crossing from your Right.
 Give right of way to fire and police department vehicles and ambulances.
 Keep to right of traffic signals at intersections.

SAFETY FIRST FOR AUTOISTS IS THE SLOGAN OF THE CITY TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

Below we give the general directions to automobile drivers which in pamphlet form is being given out to the public from time to time. Young people especially should familiarize themselves with these precautions and help to lessen danger of serious accidents.

"A FEW DON'TS"

- DON'T allow motor vehicles to emit excessive smoke.
- DON'T allow children under 16 years of age to drive motor vehicles.
- DON'T depend on the pedestrian to keep out of your way—do your share by having your car under control.
- DON'T depend on your horn to clear your path.
- DON'T depend on other drivers to prevent accidents—they may be reckless or ignorant of traffic rules.
- DON'T fail to "stop, look and listen" before crossing R. R. tracks.
- DON'T fail to report accidents to the police department.
- DON'T trust a driver who uses intoxicants.
- DON'T fail to inspect your brakes frequently.
- DON'T use a tow rope over 16 feet long.
- DON'T use "cut-out" within limits of incorporated city or town or on highways where the territory is closely built up.
- DON'T allow a car to stand on public streets or highways unattended, without stopping the motor and setting brakes.

- DON'T forget to give warning of approach to pedestrians and riders or drivers of animals or vehicles being overtaken.
- DON'T fail to give aid in case of accident. Violation of this rule is punishable by fine of \$5,000.00 or imprisonment of five years.
- DON'T fail to appear in court for trial on date set, in case of arrest.
- DON'T throw glass, nails, tacks, wire, cans, on streets or highways.
- DON'T use siren of any kind. The use of such warning signal is restricted to fire and police department machines.
- DON'T tamper with motor vehicles; misdemeanor.
- DON'T disregard the child on the curb. Remember he can start quicker than you can stop.
- DON'T leave car standing on main traveled portion of road while being repaired or while camping.
- DON'T carry luggage projecting more than 12 inches on the left hand side of car.
- DON'T turn except at corners in business districts and closely built up sections.

- DON'T change the course of your motor vehicle without giving the proper signal.
- DON'T use a head light with a glare or dazzle. It is illegal.
- DON'T use a greater candlepower lamp than is approved by the motor Vehicle Department with any device, home-made or manufactured.
- DON'T leave vehicles in front of theatre or hospital entrances. Park 10 feet on either side.
- DON'T leave car standing within 15 feet of fire hydrant.
- DON'T forget that every motor vehicle must be registered in the name of the owner and legal owner, and that the certificate of registration must be displayed in plain sight.
- DON'T operate with damaged or illegible number plates. Apply for new ones. Fee \$1.00 each.
- DON'T change address without notifying Motor Vehicle Department.
- DON'T purchase a used car without receiving a certificate of registration from the former owner.
- DON'T make false statements in application for a license. This is punishable by a fine of \$500.00 or imprisonment of 6 months.
