Notice is hereby given that on the 14th day of March, 1921, there was filed in the office of the County Clerk of Lincoln County, Nebraska, a petition asking for the formation of Drainage District No. 2 of Lincoln County, Nebraska, under Article 5, Chapter 19 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Nebraska for the year 1913, the title of which appears in the Revised Statutes of the State of Nebraska for the year 1913 as "Drainage Districts Organized by Vote of Land Owners," and the full title of which act as the same appears in Chapter 153 of the Session Laws of the State of Nebraska for the year 1907 as follows:

"AN ACT to provide for drainage districts to drain wet land and land subject to overflow; and any land which will be improved by drainage; to build dykes and levees; to construct, straighten, widen, deepen, or alter any ditch, drain, stream, or watercourse; to riprap or otherwise protect the bank of any stream or ditch; to construct, enlarge, extend, improve or maintain any drainage system; to construct, enlarge, extend, improve or maintain any system of control of surface water or running water, and the rights, obligations, and powers of such corporations, including the power of eminent domain, the creation of debts, issuing of negotiable bonds, and the levying of special assessments on such real estate and easements therein as may be benefited by such public work, and defining the duties and powers of public officials; that the boundaries of said-proposed Drainage District No. 2 of Lincoln County, Nebraska, as fixed by the Board of Commissioners of Lincoln County, Nebraska; are as follows:

Commencing at a point where the line of the south bank of the North Platte River intersects the West line of Section nine (9) in Township fourteen (14) North, of Range thirty-three (33) West of the 6th P. M. in Lincoln County, Nebraska, running thence south along the west line of said section nine (9) to the southwest corner of said Section nine (9); thence east along the south line of said Section nine (9) to the southeast corner of said Section nine (9), in Township fourteen (14) North, of Range thirty-three (33) West of the 6th P. M. in Lincoln County, Neb.; thence south along the west line of Section fifteen (15) to the southwest corner of said Section fifteen (15), in Township fourteen (14) North, of Range thirty-three (33) West of the 6th P. M. in Lincoln County, Nebraska, thence east along the south line of Sections fifteen (15), fourteen (14), and thirteen (13), all in Township fourteen (14) North, of Range thirty-three West of the 6th P. M., and east along the south line of Sections eighteen (18), seventeen (17), sixteen (16), and fifteen (15), all in Township fourteen (14) North, of Range thirty-two (32) West of the 6th P. M. in Lincoln County, Nebraska, to the southeast corner of the southwest quarter (SW 1/4) of the southwest quarter (SW 1/4) of said Section fifteen (15) in Township fourteen (14) North, of Range thirty-two (32) West of the 6th P. M. in Lincoln County, Nebraska; thence south along the west line of the East half (E 1/2) of the Northwest quarter (NW 1/4) of Section twenty-two (22), in Township fourteen (14) North, of Range thirty-two (32) West of the 6th P. M. in Lincoln County, Nebraska, a distance of forty (40) rods to the southwest corner of the Northwest quarter (NW 1/4) of the Northeast quarter (NE 1/4) of said Section twenty-two (22); thence east along the south line of the North half (N 1/2) of the North half (N 1/2) of the North half (N 1/2) of Sections twenty-two (22), twenty-three (23) and twenty-four (24), all in Township fourteen (14) North, of Range thirty-two (32) West of the 6th P.
