**DR. MARTIN LUTHER.**

Our hundred years ago, on April 13, 1521, Martin Luther, the German monk and religious reformer, faced the Imperial Council at Worms. His refusal to recant his principles brought about the mightiest intellectual and religious revolution this world has ever since the Day of Pentecost.

It was a courageous act to defy the imperial and ecclesiastical powers of the day for the sake of conscience, but that Martin Luther did. He brought about a Reformation in the Church, which reformation marks the new day in the history of freedom of mankind.

Today, Church and State alike are reaping the blessings of Luther's firm stand at Worms. Humanly speaking, the Liberty Bell with its inscription, "Proclaim Liberty throughout All the Land, unto all the Inhabitants thereof," would never have rung out the signing of the Declaration of Independence by the Continental Congress July 4, 1776, and our Charter of Liberty, the Constitution of the United States, would never have been written if Luther at Worms in 1521 had not made his magnificent stand for liberty and right.

The religious and civil liberty which we Americans prize very highly is the result of that independence which Martin Luther maintained at Worms as the birthright of man.

The CHURCH OF THE OPEN DOOR will fittingly celebrate the famous stand of Martin Luther this coming Sunday evening.

Dr. E. Klotsche of the Theological Seminary at Fremont will lecture on the above historic event Sunday evening at eight o'clock.
