THINK IT OVER

The Hershey Times puts it up to the people of that village to decide whether it will be best to install a new engine and operate its own light plant or run a transmission line from North Platte.

The North Platte Light & Power Co. offers to deliver current to the village of Hershey at the rate of six cents per kw., the village to build the transmission line, stand the expense of maintaining it and also stand the loss in transmission, since current is to be delivered at the west limits of North Platte.

Figures show that the total cost of the line, including a 15 horse power motor would be \$9,800, and that current could be delivered to patrons at the rate of 10c for power and 15c for lights and still leave a nice margin of profit for maintaining the line and meeting expenses.

The people of Hershey recently voted bonds for a light plant. The proposition now before them is whether or not it will be far better to expend this money on a transmission line and give village the conveniences of a metropolitan city with 24 hour service and the possibility of all modern conveniences and at a lower rate that it will be possible to deliver current from a village plant with six to eight hour service.

Paxton is up against the same proposition. The history of the present plant is well known. The question that should be decided now is whether or not it will be possible at the present time to take care of the future.

It may be possible for Paxton to build and maintain a transmission line from Hershey and provide for all future needs of the village so far as electrical current is concerned. The Times does not attempt to say that it can or cannot be done.
