FARM BUREAU NEWS SERVICE SUPPLIES ITEMS FOR THE TRIBUNE READERS

Plans are being made in Lancaster county to call together all retired farmers of Lincoln and suburbs with the idea of forming a club that will meet at least once a month and take lunch together and discuss some of the big subjects related to agriculture.

The manager of the Hamilton county shipping association has just announced that he expects to be prepared to handle cream on or before June first, as soon as he can get into his new office and have machinery installed. Poultry will also be handled next month.

A simple poultry culling demonstration conducted in Platte County by the farm bureau, resulted in one farm making more profit from the poultry yard than the cornfield. The total receipts from this flock were \$62.00 and the total expense was \$49.00.

At a meeting of Kanred Wheat growers of Webster county, recently P. H. Stewart, Agronomy Specialist explained the method of inspection and certification for this year and stated that Webster county ranked first in the production of Kanred Wheat.

C. H. Gustafson, President of the U. S. Grain Growers, Inc., visited Lincoln last week end following a trip into Kansas where he addressed the farmers meetings at Emporia, Newton, Wichita, Hutchinson, Larned, Manhattan, and Clay Center.

In reply to a question, raised by the legal service department of the state federation, the State Tax Commissioner has told the county boards he fees that the personal property return should be published in local newspapers and if enough of the people in each county will urge that this be done, the board will no doubt be glad to make the returns public.

Protests from sugar beet growers in western Nebraska, Wyoming and Colorado have been raised, objecting to a limitation of immigration that does not provide for Mexican agricultural labor to work temporarily upon the farms, according to a statement from the office of H. D. Lute, Secretary of the state federation.
