BOARD OF COUNTY EQUALIZATION TO HOLD SESSIONS FOR SIX DAYS

Elsewhere is published a notice regarding the meeting of the Board of Equalization for Lincoln County. It will meet on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of next week and on the same days of the following week and will hear all complaints regarding taxation. These complaints must be written out and filed with County Clerk A. B. Allen before 5 o'clock of the last day or they will not be heard. The object of these sessions is to hear and adjust all inequalities in the assessments against property in Lincoln County. Every person who has taxable property, should find out, if he does not know, the assessed value of his property. If it is wrongly or unfairly assessed he should make a showing in writing and take the case before the Commissioners for adjustment. After the 23rd it will be too late as the amounts will be certified to the state.

OBITUARY.

Karl Heinrich Kammerer was born in Baden, Germany, January 15, 1864. He emigrated to the United States of America with his parents in the spring of 1868 and located in Richardson county, and moved to Nuckolls county in the spring of 1879. He was confirmed April 7, 1889 as a member of the Free Evangelical Church. On November 23, 1893 he was married to Margretha Rieg of Spring, Neb. and resided at Dresher, Neb. To this union twelve children, seven boys and five girls were born, all of whom are living.

He moved his family to Sutherland March 1, 1906 and removed in the spring of 1912 to a homestead near Flats, where he died May 24, 1921, being 57 years, 4 months and 9 days old. The cause of his death was paralysis, he having had a stroke nine years ago and being in ill health since then. He leaves to mourn his death his wife, his children, Mrs. Ida Connor and Mrs. Clara McKain of North Platte; Mrs. Helen Schultz, of Grand Island, Wilfred of Blisbee, Ariz., Louis, Amelia, Dorsey, Julia, Karl, Bismarck, Otto and Francis Kammerer; three brothers, William of San Diego, Cal., Philip of DeWeese, Neb., Christian of Falls City, Neb., two sisters having preceded him.

The funeral services were held from the Lutheran church at Sutherland, Rev. Grenwald of Paxton preaching the funeral sermon, and he was laid to rest in the Sutherland cemetery.

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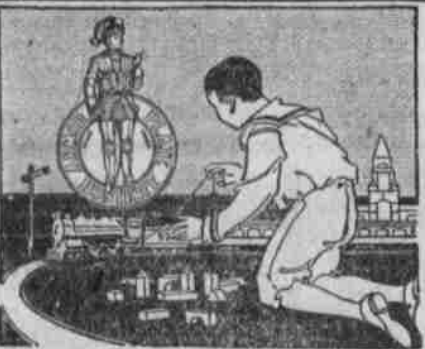
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
