**EDITORIAL**

With over \$275 in prizes assured at this time it is reasonable to expect that the parade on the morning of the Fourth of July will be one of the biggest ever seen here on the Fourth. We expect to be in the parade and have our place all picked out but it will not be in competition with anyone else so the entire list of prizes is still open.

The school men in Nebraska are a unit in demanding that school teachers shall not use tobacco. They have not had any trouble so far with the lady members of the faculties but once in a while there is a man who tries it. In most cases he is soon let out. Smoking among boys is one of the great evils of our young fellows. Facts and opinions are practically unanimous in declaring tobacco an enemy to growing youth. Then those who are the leaders of these boys should set an example by refraining from smoking. This has been the argument and that is the reason why Nebraska school men do not smoke. The North Platte Board of Education has been very liberal in its requirements of its teachers but it has never had a smoker in its faculty for a very long time.
