Five more Boys' and Girls' Clubs have been organized in Dawson County since Miss Maude Bean has taken up the work of County Club Agent. This makes a total of 12 clubs with an enrollment of 150 members.

was made at the meeting of the executive board held in Chicago, June 21.

Tentative plans of the American Farm Bureau Federation for the cooperative purchase of coal direct from mine to consumer have been outlined by the committee having it in charge. Definite announcement of the plan will be made later.

F. D. Keim of the State Agricultural College spent two days in Douglas County assisting Agricultural Agent Maxwell in grain inspection work. They inspected nine fields of Kanred wheat; three of Nebraska No. 6 wheat four of Rosen rye and one field of Nebraska No. 21 oats. All the fields promise high yields. Approximately 3,000 of Kanred wheat will be available in Douglas County for seed this fall. The Kanred and Nebraska No. 6 wheat compare favorably in possible yield but Kanred showed less orange rust than any of the other fields of wheat.

F. H. Lancaster, County Agricultural Agent in Holt County has resigned and accepted the offer of the Holt County Farm Bureau to become its secretary, taking charge of the county marketing work and other details. This is the first county in the state to engage a paid secretary to devote all of his time to Farm Bureau Federation work in the county. This action on the part of the Holt County Farm Bureau and the selection of Mr. Lancaster is largely the result of the efficient manner in which he handled the marketing of Holt County's large crop of hay in 1920.

Partial returns have been received from ten different states on the referendum vote taken by members of the American Farm Bureau Federation on sixteen national questions as follows:

- No. 1 — Do you favor commodity financing based on bonded warehouse receipts? Yes—51,424. No—1,289.
- No. 2 — Do you favor live stock financing based on an adequate pledge of animals and feed? Yes—49,662. No—2,366.
- No. 3 — Do you favor the development of a personal rural credits system based on proper safeguards? Yes—36,904. No—1,418.
- No. 4 — That authority be granted the Federal Reserve Board to so classify rediscounts as to give priority to loans for basic production of all

kinds? Yes — 34,946 No — 1,651.

No. 5 — Increasing limit, Federal land mortgages from \$10,000 to \$25,000. Yes — 28,931 No — 8,169.

No. 6 — Asking Congress to submit federal constitutional amendment prohibiting tax-free securities. Yes — 32,823 No P 4,596.

No. 7 — Continuance of excess profit tax. Yes — 37,280 No — 2,675.

No. 8 — Are you opposed to general sales tax? Yes — 17,947 No — 22,393.

No. 9 — Will you be able to move greater quantity of farm products if freight adequately reduce? Yes — 39,669 No — 1,235.

No. 10 — For the building of farm-to-market before construction of transcontinental highways. Yes — 38,279 No — 1,424.

No. 11 — For Great Lakes—St. Lawrence waterways. Yes — 36,975 No — 3,223.

No. 12 — Do you favor other waterway development for transportation, reclamation, and water power at this time? Yes — 9,455 No — 6,597.

No. 13 — Placing packers under government regulation to be administered by department of agriculture. Yes — 36,459 No — 2,151.

No. 14 — For making illegal "short selling" in agricultural products. Yes — 38,884 No — 1,752.

No. 15 — For "truth-in-fabric" legislation. Yes — 41,713 No — 323.

No. 16 — Legislation for enabling co-operative marketing. Yes — 41,548 No — 376.
