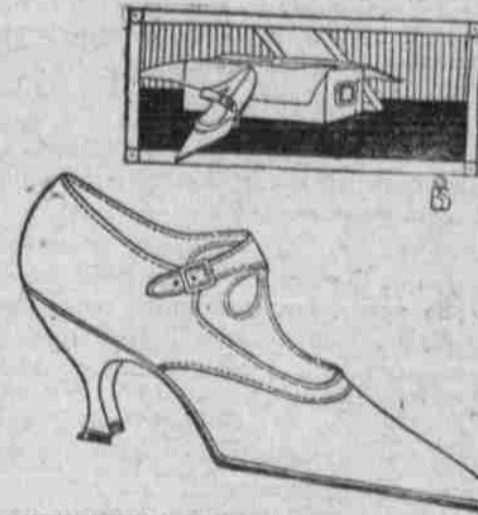

Washington.—One of the most popular and efficient appointments yet made by the new administration, is that of Scott C. Bone, who has just been nominated by President Harding as governor of Alaska. Mr. Bone, who is one of the best known of American newspaper editors, was publicity manager of the Republican national committee last year. Previously, as editor of the Seattle Post-Intelligencer, he gave careful attention and study to Alaskan matters and it is expected that he will make a strong governor from the very start. Mr. Bone has large experience with the problems of news print paper, and inasmuch as Alaska is a large great field for paper pulp, there is no doubt that he goes to Alaska with this matter very much in mind.
