FARM BUREAU NEWS SERVICE SUPPLIES ITEMS FOR THE TRIBUNE READERS

The Department of Agriculture estimates that nearly 7,000,000 domestic animals were lost from disease or exposure on the farms of the United States for the year ending with April, 1921. Their value was about \$150,000,000. These losses comprise about 369,000 horses and mules, 585,000 lambs, 1,223,000 mature sheep, 1,742,000 cattle, and 2,946,000 hogs.

The value of purebred livestock, say specialists of the United States Department of Agriculture, is most noticeable in those cases in which the capabilities of the animals are measured most directly. Among farm animals the best illustration can be found in dairy cattle, though careful yearly tests of milk and butter fat production are relatively recent affairs.

The increased interest in fruit juices has caused the United States Department of Agriculture to issue a farmer's bulletin called "Unfermented Grape Juice—How to make it in the Home." According to this publication unfermented grape juice is one of the cheapest, yet one of the best products which can be made from grapes.

A farmer's poultry flock of 94 hens was culled by a specialist from the College of Agriculture and a few suggestions made as to improved methods of feeding. The report of the owner indicates the advantages of culling and the promptness with which results are secured.

It may be interesting to many of our readers to know that one of the big wheat men of Keith Co. says he expects to be able to market his 1921 crop for 60 cents per bushel or less.

Concrete feeding floors for hogs are becoming increasingly popular among Nebraska farmers, according to the observations of extension men of the College of Agriculture.

RESOLUTION

Resolution Providing for the Calling and holding of an Election to Authorize the Issuing and Sale of Bonds of Lincoln County, State of Nebraska, in the Amount of One Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$165,000.00) to Pay for the Repairs, Construction and Reconstruction of Certain Bridges.

WHEREAS, the following described bridges, to-wit: The Birdwood Precinct bridge over the North Platte River north of Sutherland, between Section lines Four (4) and Five (5), and Eight (8) and Nine (9), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty-three (33) West of the 6th P. M.; the South Platte bridge over the South Platte River, south of Sutherland, located on the north and south center line in Section Thirty-two (22), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty-three (33), West of the 6th P. M.; the Hershey bridge over the North Platte River north of Hershey, located on section lines between Sections Eight (8) and Nine (9), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty-two (22), West of the 6th P. M.; the Bostwick bridge over the South Platte River south of Hershey, located between Section Twenty-eight (28) and Twenty-nine (29), and Thirty-two (32) and Thirty-three (33), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty-two (22) West of the 6th P. M.; the North River bridge over the North Platte River north of North Platte, located in East Half (E 1/2) of Section Twenty-eight (28), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty (30) West of the 6th P. M.; the Osgood Bridge over the South Platte River, south of North Platte, located in West Half (W 1/2) of Sections Four (4) and Nine (9), Township Thirteen (13), Range Thirty (30) West of the 6th P. M.; the Lincoln Highway bridge over the North Platte River, east of North Platte, located on section lines between Section Thirty-five (35) and Thirty-six (36), Township 14, Range 30 and Sections One (1) and Two (2), Township 13, Range 30, all West of the 6th P. M.; the Maxwell bridge across the Platte River, located through Sections Twenty-eight (28), Thirty-two (32), Thirty-three (33), Township 13, Range 28, all West of the 6th P. M.; the Brady bridge across the Platte River located through Sections Eleven (11), Fourteen (14), Fifteen (15), Twenty-two (22), Twenty-three (23), Twenty-six (26) and Twenty-seven (27), Township 12, Range 27 West of the 6th P. M., all of said bridges being located in said County.

Resolved, That at said election the following question shall be submitted to the electors of the County and printed upon the ballots to be used thereat, to-wit: "Shall Lincoln County, Nebraska, issue and sell the negotiable bonds of the County, to be styled and known as Internal Improvement bonds of Lincoln County, Nebraska, in denominations of \$1000.00 each and numbered from 1 to 165 inclusive, in the sum of \$165,000.00, to bear interest at six (6%) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and \$16,500.00 of such bond issue to become due and payable ten (10) years from the date of issue to-wit: (1) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable twelve (12) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable thirteen (13) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable fourteen (14) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable fifteen (15) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable sixteen (16) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable seventeen (17) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable eighteen (18) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable nineteen (19) years after date of issue; and the said bonds to be issued for the purpose of paying for the repair, construction or reconstruction of the following described bridges, including the approaches thereto, namely: The Birdwood Precinct bridge over the North Platte River north of Sutherland, between Section lines Four (4) and Five (5), and Eight (8) and Nine (9), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty-three (33) West of the 6th P. M.; the South Platte bridge over the South Platte River, south of Sutherland, located on the north and south center line of Section 32, Township 14, Range 30, all West of the 6th P. M.; the Osgood bridge over the North Platte River north of Hershey, located on section lines between Sections Eight (8) and Nine (9), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty-two (22), West of the 6th P. M.; the Bostwick bridge over the South Platte River south of Hershey, located between Section Twenty-eight (28) and Twenty-nine (29), and Thirty-two (32) and Thirty-three (33), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty-two (22) West of the 6th P. M.; the North River bridge over the North Platte River north of North Platte, located in East Half (E 1/2) of Section Twenty-eight (28), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty (30) West of the 6th P. M.; the Osgood Bridge over the South Platte River, south of North Platte, located in West Half (W 1/2) of Sections Four (4) and Nine (9), Township Thirteen (13), Range Thirty (30) West of the 6th P. M.; the Lincoln Highway bridge over the North Platte River, east of North Platte, located on section lines between Section Thirty-five (35) and Thirty-six (36), Township 14, Range 30 and Sections One (1) and Two (2), Township 13, Range 30, all West of the 6th P. M.; the Maxwell bridge across the Platte River, located through Sections Twenty-eight (28), Thirty-two (32), Thirty-three (33), Township 13, Range 28, all West of the 6th P. M.; the Brady bridge across the Platte River located through Sections Eleven (11), Fourteen (14), Fifteen (15), Twenty-two (22), Twenty-three (23), Twenty-six (26) and Twenty-seven (27), Township 12, Range 27 West of the 6th P. M., all of said bridges being located in said County. And that the proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be used for the purpose of paying for the repair, construction or reconstruction of the following described bridges in said County, including the approaches thereto, namely: The Birdwood Precinct bridge over the North Platte River north of Sutherland, between Sections lines 4 and 5, and 8 and 9, Township 14, Range 33 West of the 6th P. M.; the South Platte bridge over the South Platte River, south of Sutherland, located on north and south center line of Section 32, Township 14, Range 33 West of the 6th P. M.; the Hershey bridge over the North Platte River north of Hershey, located on Section lines between Sections 8 and 9, Township 14, Range 32 West of the 6th P. M.; the Bostwick bridge over the South Platte River, south of Hershey, located between Section 28 and 29, and 22 and 33, Township 14, Range 32 West of the 6th P. M.; the North

Commissioners deem it expedient, desirable and proper to issue and sell negotiable bonds of the County, to be styled and known as Internal Improvement bonds of Lincoln County, Nebraska, in denominations of \$1000.00 each and numbered from 1 to 165 inclusive, in the sum of \$165,000.00 for the aforesaid purpose, and; WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is authorized by the laws of the State to submit to the qualified electors of the County the question of issuing said bonds and of levying the necessary tax to pay the interest and principal of such bonds as the same becomes due, and; WHEREAS, it is apparent and it is estimated that the cost of the repairs, construction and reconstruction of the above described bridges, including the approaches thereto, it at least the sum of \$165,000.00.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Lincoln, in the State of Nebraska, as follows:

That a special election of the qualified electors of the said County of Lincoln, be and is hereby called and ordered to be held on the 18th day of August, 1921, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A. M. and 8:00 o'clock P. M., for the purpose of voting upon the question of issuing and selling the negotiable bonds of the County, to be styled and known as Internal Improvement bonds of Lincoln County, Nebraska, in denominations of \$1000.00 each and numbered from 1 to 165 inclusive, in the sum of \$165,000.00, to bear an interest rate of 6 per cent per annum, on coupons attached, payable semi-annually at the office of the County Treasurer of Lincoln County, Nebraska, and \$16,500.00 to become due and payable ten (10) years from the date of issue; \$16,500.00 of said bonds to become due eleven (11) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable twelve (12) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable thirteen (13) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable fourteen (14) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable fifteen (15) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable sixteen (16) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable seventeen (17) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable eighteen (18) years after date of issue; \$16,500.00 to become due and payable nineteen (19) years after date of issue; and the said bonds to be issued for the purpose of paying for the repair, construction or reconstruction of the following described bridges, including the approaches thereto, namely: The Birdwood Precinct bridge over the North Platte River north of Sutherland, between Section lines Four (4) and Five (5), and Eight (8) and Nine (9), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty-three (33) West of the 6th P. M.; the Bostwick bridge over the South Platte River south of Hershey, located between Section Twenty-eight (28) and Twenty-nine (29), and Thirty-two (32) and Thirty-three (33), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty-two (22) West of the 6th P. M.; the North River bridge over the North Platte River north of North Platte, located in East Half (E 1/2) of Section Twenty-eight (28), Township Fourteen (14), Range Thirty (30) West of the 6th P. M.; the Osgood Bridge over the South Platte River, south of North Platte, located in West Half (W 1/2) of Sections Four (4) and Nine (9), Township Thirteen (13), Range Thirty (30) West of the 6th P. M.; the Lincoln Highway bridge over the North Platte River, east of North Platte, located on section lines between Section Thirty-five (35) and Thirty-six (36), Township 14, Range 30 and Sections One (1) and Two (2), Township 13, Range 30, all West of the 6th P. M.; the Maxwell bridge across the Platte River, located through Sections Twenty-eight (28), Thirty-two (32), Thirty-three (33), Township 13, Range 28, all West of the 6th P. M.; the Brady bridge across the Platte River located through Sections Eleven (11), Fourteen (14), Fifteen (15), Twenty-two (22), Twenty-three (23), Twenty-six (26) and Twenty-seven (27), Township 12, Range 27 West of the 6th P. M., all of said bridges being located in said County.

Sec. 2. That the County Clerk shall proclaim and give notice of the places and time of holding such election as by law required, and he is hereby ordered and directed to give such notice of such election by publishing for four (4) weeks prior to the said date of said election in the North Platte Telegraph and the North Platte Semi-Weekly Tribune, official newspapers of said County, and likewise by publishing for four (4) weeks prior to said date in the following newspapers, to-wit: The Sutherland Courier, Wallace Winner, Hershey Times and Brady Vindicator, and also by posting or causing to be posted a copy of the election notice in at least three (3) public places in each of the general precincts in the County not less than twenty (20) days prior to said date of such election, and such notice shall embrace and state the question to be submitted as hereinbefore set out and recited, and the said Clerk is hereby empowered and instructed to take all such other and further steps as may be necessary to provide for the holding of said election, printing the ballots therefor, furnishing the necessary tally-sheets or books and stationery with which to conduct the election and ascertain the returns, and to fully provide for and conduct said special election as is required by law to conduct general County elections and obtain returns thereof.

Sec. 3. That the voting places where this election shall be held, the regular voting places at which general elections are held in the various wards or precincts of the County, and at which said polling places the last General election was held.

The voting places where this election shall be held, the regular voting places at which general elections are held in the various wards or precincts of the County, and at which said polling places the last General election was held.
