EDITORIAL.

We certainly approve of the rule adopted by the Campfire Council prohibiting the campfire girls from entertaining their boy friends while at camp. Some of the girls may not like it but the Council knows very well that it is the only possible way to live up to the spirit of the order. Campfire is not a social club. It does not include boys in its scope. Campfire is the spirit of girlbood, given a free and natural reign and precedes the period of mating. It teaches friendliness to all human beings but not the selection of a single individual outside of the girl's own family. Any girl seeking to grow in campfire will separate campfire from the boy question and keep them separate.

NATURE STUDY IN OUR CITY PARKS.

In Memorial Park and in both City Park and the Cemetery the Nebraska Cottontail (Lepis floridanus similus-Nelson) has been observed on numerous oceasions. This little cottontail rabbit is found all through this part of the country. It differs in several minor ways from the Prairie Cottontail of the southeastern part of the state and from the Plains Cottontall of the Northwest. The cottontail is often seen about the city and does some damage In gardens The cottontail rears several litters of young rabbits each year and they make

fine pets. Any child loves to play with a baby rabbit but they can not stand much handling. Cottontalls are hunted to some extent in this community but their scarcity does not make them furnish good sport for the hunter. They live on grass. stems, seeds, bark and grains. During very cold weather they eat the bark from fruit trees if it is not protected.
