The Aphis is a very small, green, soft bodied insect that is easily over looked, it has sucking mouth parts and destroys the plant by extract- Sunday. ing the juices. A good sign of the vines begin to wilt and turn brown, the trip by auto.

The best remedies for control is to spray the plants with a solution made by mixing a teaspoonful to a tablespoonful of Nicotine Sulphate partment Store. or Black Leaf 40 in a gallon of cide and the Aphis must be hit by Mrs. P. A. Norton. the spray to be killed. The spray can be applied with a hand sprayer.

The Squash Bug (anasa tristis) is another insect that destroys the vines of the Cucumber, Squashes and Melons. The full grown bug is a little over one half inch long and is of a rusty black color above The best and yellow beneath. means of control for this insect is hand picking in the morning and evening at which times the bugs are somewhat torpid.
