

PLANT LICE AND SQUASH BUG CAN BE CONTROLLED SAYS EXPERT.

The following letter is a message to every gardener in Lincoln County To the Editor:

Several inquiries have lately come to the office regarding the control of the Cucumber Aphid or commonly called the plant louse. The Aphid is a very small, green, soft bodied insect that is easily overlooked, it has sucking mouth parts and destroys the plant by extracting the juices. A good sign of the presence of the Aphid is, when the vines begin to wilt and turn brown.

The best remedies for control is to spray the plants with a solution made by mixing a teaspoonful to a tablespoonful of Nicotine Sulphate or Black Leaf 40 in a gallon of water. This is a contact insecticide and the Aphid must be hit by the spray to be killed. The spray can be applied with a hand sprayer.

The Squash Bug (anasa tristis) is another insect that destroys the vines of the Cucumber, Squashes and Melons. The full grown bug is a little over one half inch long and is of a rusty black color above and yellow beneath. The best means of control for this insect is hand picking in the morning and evening at which times the bugs are somewhat torpid.

Boards laid among the vines at night will be found to have many bugs under them in the morning, and these may be killed by crushing or otherwise.
