NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS AND BIDDERS

Sealed bids will be received by the City Council of the City of North Platte, Nebraska, at the office of O. F. Elder, City Clerk of said city up until 8 o'clock P. M. Sept. 6th, 1921 for furnishing labor and material for the construction of the proposed Water

Main Extension for said city in accordance with the plans and specifications on file with the City Clerk. Said engineer's estimate of the cost of constructing said Water Main complete in place is as follows:

56,440 ft. six inch Class B cast iron pipe including 32 6x6 crosses;

One 6x6x8 cross, 83 4x6x6 T's all class B cast iron \$1.45 per ft.

53 six (6) inch hub end, bronze mounted double gate valves suitable for 125 lb. water pressure, with cast iron adjustable valve boxes complete in place at \$33.00 each.

33 hydrants bronze mounted, with four inch inlet and two (2) two and one-half (2 1/2) inch nozzles and of sufficient length to connect with pipe four and one-half (4 1/2) feet below the surface with 12 feet of 4 inch cast iron pipe with each complete in place \$65.00 each.

Taking up 2,688 feet of four (4) inch cast iron pipe 20c per foot, furnishing and laying 2064 feet of two inch gal. pipe complete in place at 45c per foot.

Said proposed Water Main Extension includes the following material:

940 tons of 6 inch class B cast iron pipe.

12 tons special cast iron castings.

53 six (6) inch hub end, bronze mounted, double gate valves, suitable for 125 lbs. water pressure with cast iron adjustable valve boxes.

83 bronze mounted fire hydrants, with four (4) inch inlet and each hydrant provided with two (2) two and one-half (2 1/2) inch nozzles and of sufficient length to connect with pipe four and one-half (4 1/2) feet below the ground surface.

300 flange corporation cocks.

200 lead flange goose-necks.

And said construction includes the following items of labor and construction work is for the installation of the material hereinbefore described.

Digging and back filling 56440 feet of six (6) inch Water Main Ditch, four and one-half (4 1/2) feet deep and 936 feet of ditch four and one-half (4 1/2) feet deep for four (4) inch hydrant branches.

Laying 56440 feet of six (6) inch Class B Cast Iron Water Main and 936 feet of four (4) inch Class B Cast Iron Water Main.

Setting fifty-three (53) six (6) inch hub end double gate valve in boxes.

Setting eighty-three (83) four and one-half (4 1/2) foot fire hydrants, taking up 2688 ft. of 4 inch cast iron pipe and making necessary connections between said new 6 inch mains and present Water Works system as shown on plans on file with City Clerk of the City of North Platte, Nebraska.

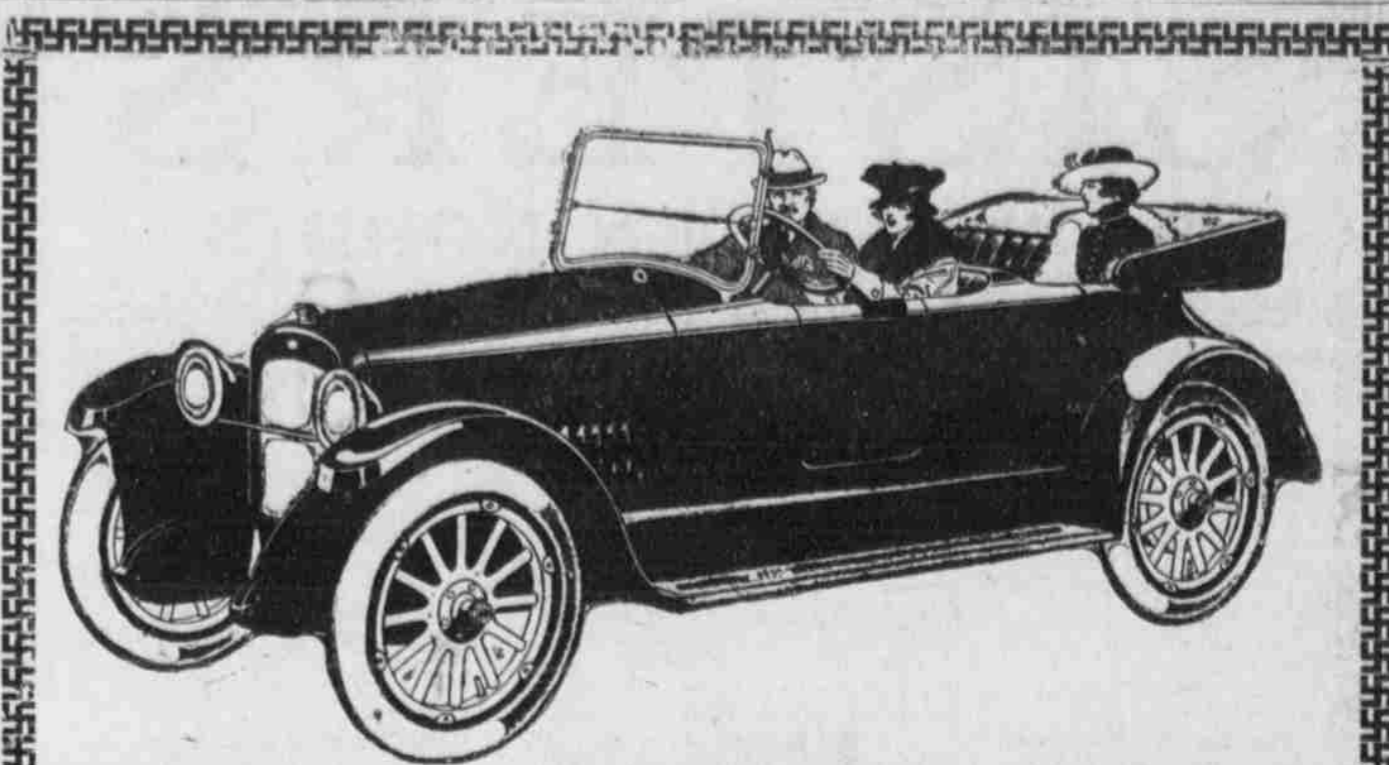

The following material to be furnished by the city of North Platte for class "C" bid to-wit: all cast iron pipe an special castings and also all oakum and lead or metallum necessary for making joints in same and also the valves and boxes and hydrants and stone and gravel for placing about hydrants.

The engineer's estimate for material for class "B" bid is \$64,734.00.

The engineer's estimate for labor for class "C" bid is \$27,800.00.

All bids must be made on proposals in the specifications furnished upon application by the City Clerk and must be accompanied by a certified check of two per cent (2%) of the total bid.
